

The Livermore Chamber of Commerce filed its articles of incorporation with the office of the California Secretary of State on May 11, 1937 (recorded by the Alameda County Clerk on May 13, 1937). This nugget of chamber history was uncovered during research for a recent speaking engagement. The document refers to an existing association in the incorporation and there is evidence dating back to 1927 in the reproduction of an early Livermore Chamber of Commerce brochure. Over the decades, sixty-three names, literally a "who's who" of past and current Livermore business and community leaders, chaired its board of directors. In 2011, in order to reflect the regional nature of its membership, the board of directors added "Valley" to the name of the association. Today, the Livermore Valley Chamber of Commerce membership is more than 600 members strong, representing a highly respected and economically diverse range of 21st century industries and organizations. The LVCC team will recognize this major milestone with a number of projects and programs over the coming months. We hope that you will join us in these activities and in recognizing this major milestone in the distinguished legacy of this incredible organization.
