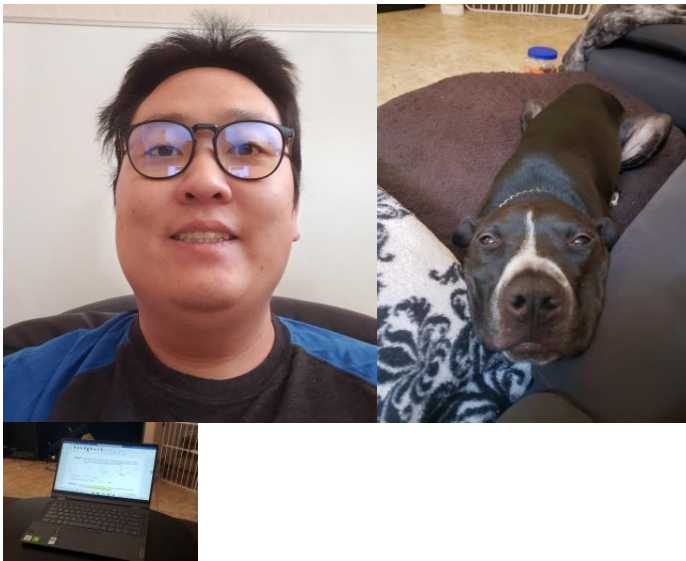

Physical Education Teacher

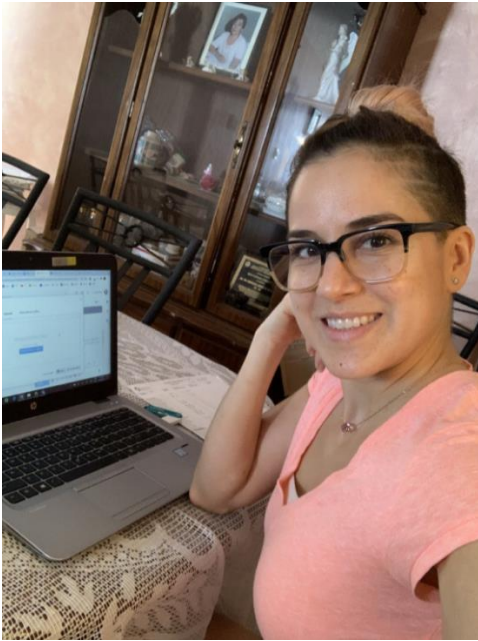
My after-school routine in high school usually included getting a snack from the vending machine and then heading to either volleyball, basketball, or softball practice!

Spanish Teacher, 2 & 3 Honors

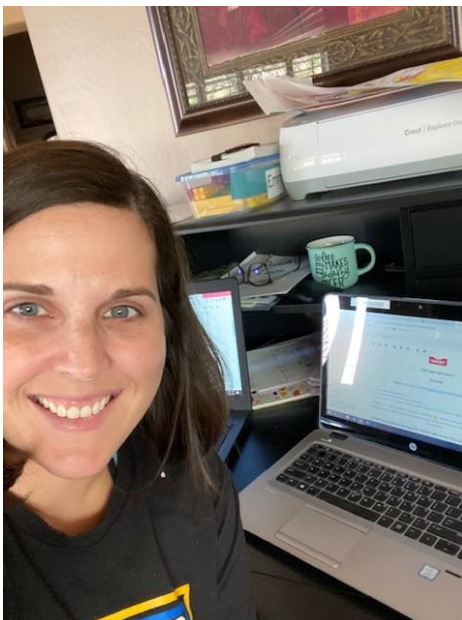
When I was in high school I would stay after school to practice track. Afterwards, I would go home, eat with my family, watch TV, nap and hang out with friends. That was the life! XP

After school I was always playing a sport- football, soccer, and then baseball. Then homework at night.

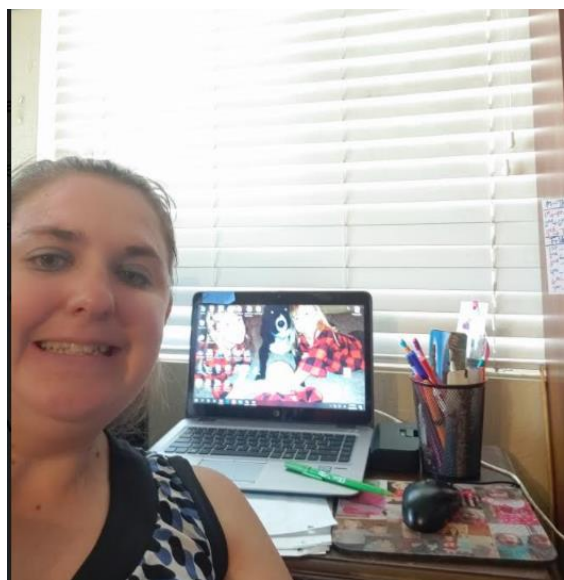


Jackie Bunker

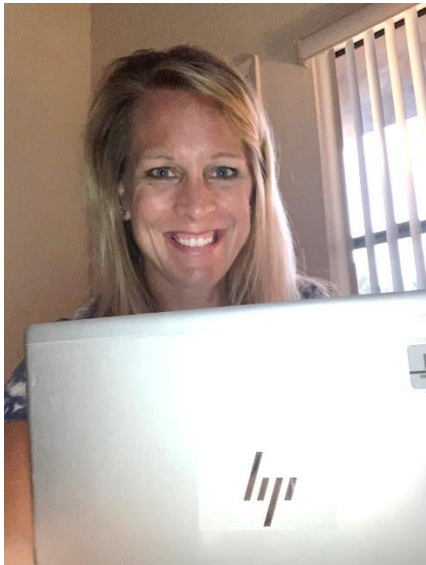


Jean Leiphart

My afternoon routine in high school was actually to take a nap. I remember being quite tired when I got home from school. Bad sleeping habits I suppose!

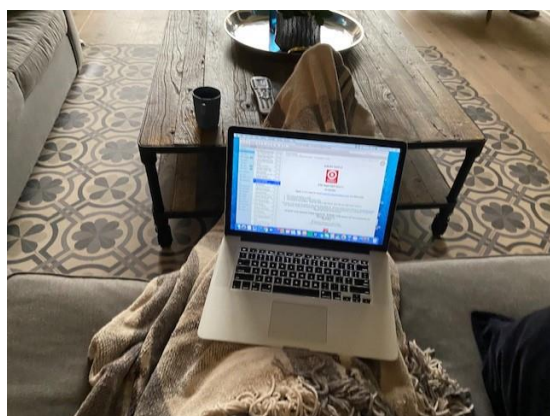
