



PSAT Q's and A's

Q: When is the PSAT?

- The PSAT 8/9 will be given to 9th graders and the PSAT/NMSQT to 10th-11th graders on **Wed, Oct 10** at LHS during the school day. There will be a 2-hour early release that day.

Q: What should I bring to the PSAT?

- #2 wooden pencils
- An approved calculator (click [here](#) for list of approved calculators).
- Students will have two 5-minute breaks during the test and may bring snacks/drinks to eat during the breaks.

Q: What materials are available to help me prepare?

- PSAT/NMSQT guides/practice tests are available [here](#).
- **The** College Board partners with Khan Academy to provide practice tests, available [here](#). Once PSAT reports are available, incorrect PSAT answers are linked to Khan Academy tutorials, which provide explanations for each question.

Q: When and how will I receive my PSAT scores?

- By January 2019, scores for the 2018 PSAT will be available online to students through your free College Board accounts [here](#) using your student ID number. You must have or create a College Board account to view scores.

Q: Will I get a detailed PSAT score report?

- Score reports, which help students pinpoint where additional study may be needed, are paid for by FCPS for 9th and 10th graders and are \$20 for 11th graders. (Use [MySchoolBucks](#) to pay for juniors' reports.)
