# In 2023, CME demonstrated its commitment to improving community well-being through various initiatives.

Our our Recovery and Support Services team served over 7,000 meals to support clients on their pathway to recovery, thanks in part to 20,000 pounds of donated food from Feed Spokane. We achieved licensing as a Behavioral Health Agency, increasing access to behavioral healthcare for individuals in recovery. Our ECEAP program expanded to 75 slots, enhancing access to quality early childhood education, and our Professional Development department provided over 460 hours of training, improving outcomes for children. Additionally, our Early Achievers Coaches supported 452 Child Care Providers across 11 counties in Eastern Washington. Employee growth was significant, with our team expanding to 89 members by December and the creation of 22 new positions. We launched our Social Enterprise Group, emphasizing sustainability and innovation, and welcomed new board members who brought fresh perspectives to our organization. Throughout the year, we continued to drive positive change through innovative programs and strategic partnerships, addressing systemic challenges and fostering a brighter future for our community

Recovery Café's 24 weekly Recovery circles, active membership, and large orientation attendance demonstrate its expansive reach in fostering healing and solidarity among individuals struggling with addiction.

The rebooted Foundational Community Supports (FCS) program's expansion to Pasco, increased staff, and service to 80 clients for housing and employment signify a significant impact on vulnerable populations, directly improving lives and addressing critical needs.

## **Proactive:**

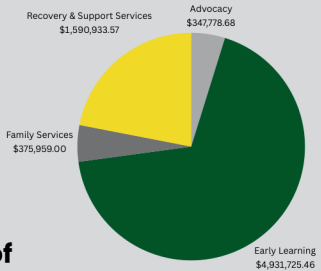
