After high school, he studied theology and biblical languages. Since 2003, he has been the rector of parishes in Augusta GA, Granite Springs NY, & College Park GA, lived for a brief time as a brother in a monastery in Boston MA, and most recently served as the Dean of St. Paul's Cathedral in Des Moines IA. After a diagnosis of early onset Parkinsonism, he had to leave full-time ministry in 2022, returning back to the area where his family still live.
