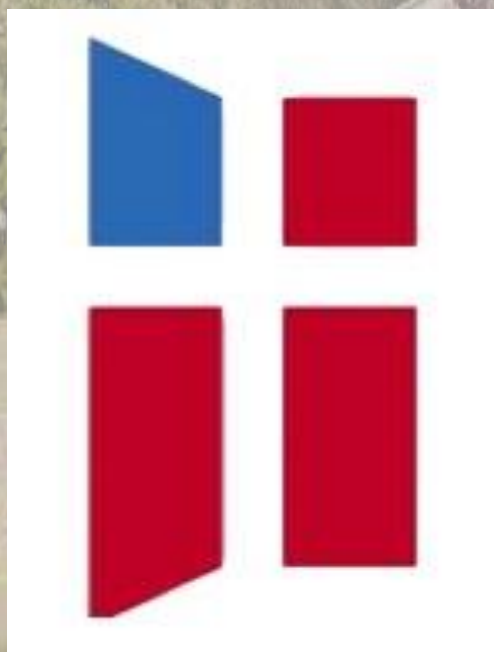

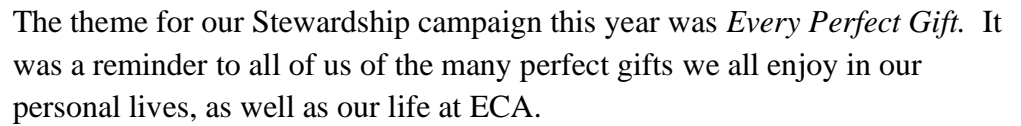

It has been a wonderfully productive year for the Buildings & Grounds ministry. ECA volunteers completed many essential projects and provided much needed maintenance, all while following COVID-19 safety protocols. We are truly blessed to have so many parishioners willing to help when asked to do so. Thank you, to everyone, that helped care for our church buildings and grounds this past year.



Buildings



- Back door in Activities Building has been replaced
- Storm door on St. Martha's Porch has been replaced
- A door was added to the Ruby Room for access to the Pavilion
- Breezeway between the Ruby Room and the Pavilion has been completed
- Lights and fans were added in the Pavilion
- Ramp on the front of the Activities Building has been repaired
- AC maintenance was completed in both the Swift building and Activities Building
- Track lighting has been installed over the choir area
- New gutters were installed on the sanctuary
- A locking metal cabinet for Altar Guild items was donated and installed

Grounds

- Two successful ECA Work Days this year – March and October
- New directional signs have been installed near the Swift building
- New plants in front of the Activities Building and Pavilion
- Decorative Stones have been placed in front of Activities Building
- River rock installed near the Pavilion to help with drainage

Behind the Scenes

- Constant effort to control weeds in flower beds, around the pond, mulched areas, and parking lot
- Scrap metal recycled
- Two trees, determined to be a danger, were removed
- Improved the landscape behind the Activities building to improve drainage and help keep water out of the basement
- Volunteer pressure-washed Church siding in breezeway
- Bi-weekly watering continues for new plants

Future Plans

Parish Life

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, we did not know what to expect at the beginning of the year. It was hard to plan events and gatherings with the looming thought and threat of shutdowns that could force cancellations of scheduled activities. The last thing anyone ever wants is to get their hopes up for something just to be let down.



We knew gatherings were much needed after a year where most people had very little interaction with anyone outside their immediate family, but we didn’t know if anyone was truly ready for such gatherings. We decided to gauge the overall interest of a parish wide in-person event and the feedback we received was very positive. At that point we started planning for a Welcome Back gathering, which ultimately turned into a cookout and game night that took place in May.

With the pavilion completed, we were able to use it for several activities such as our first ever Pictures Under the Pavilion, which took place in August. We were able to hold a reception for a Baptism. We also held a Back-to-School Ice Cream Social and Blessing of the Backpacks under the pavilion in August. The Men’s Fishing Trip took place at the end of September in Florida. All Saints Sunday was celebrated in November, and we included a Fall Festival and Blessing of the Pets

the same day. We closed out our calendar year in December with Fire Pit Caroling and our first ever parish wide Secret Santa event. In addition to these events, Dominoes started back up as well as some other small group formations that had several gatherings throughout the year.

We now turn our eyes and plans to 2022, which we hope includes more activities for our parish and less COVID-19 variants and outbreaks. With the pavilion fully open and operational we feel we can host activities rain or shine, warm or cold, and safely practice social distancing when required and for those who simply prefer it. We encourage and welcome any and all thoughts and ideas for different things we can do together as a parish.

Connecting Ministry

Connecting Ministry began not long before this global pandemic hit, and what a needed ministry it is! The need to feel connected has never been greater. We began the year with a lot of calls, letters and cards to check in on people who were quarantining at home. In August we had a successful ‘Get Acquainted Luncheon’ for some of the newer families worshiping with us. Most, if not all, who attended have joined ECA.

Once we were able to gather more, we formed a new social group for single ECA ladies to build upon relationships. This group meets for luncheons and/or dinners monthly. The attendance has increased as excitement grows among these ladies.

Holy Rollers continues to provide rides to those who need them in order to attend church, doctor appointments and even for a young ECA member who needed rides to school. We have continued to improve and utilize our online photo directory, which included asking members to provide new photos to keep profiles up to date. This has been a wonderful resource. We have gathered to socialize and connect around the fire-pit several times, and we fellowshiped on All Saints Sunday. Every gathering held gives us an opportunity to connect with others.

Our first annual Secret Santa exchange took place in December, thanks to the suggestion from Scott Hogan. Those wanting to participate wrote their name on a slip of paper and placed it in Santa’s box. Names were drawn on the first Sunday then gifts were exchanged two weeks later (\$12 gift limit). The Vestry and other ECA leaders continue to make calls to those members who haven’t returned to worship. Emails, texts, cards and flowers have also been sent when deemed appropriate.



We expect to increase the social activities in 2022 as COVID restrictions are relaxed. The ECA Book Club and Foyer Dinners will begin again, and re-establishing the coffee hour is at the top of our list too.

Despite the challenges of gathering and connecting to others during this time of COVID, we have been encouraged and strive to make members of ECA feel connected to one another.

Reach Ministries

Reach is ECA's Outreach and Inreach group. We look for ways to care for parishioners who may have needs, as well as serving both ongoing and urgent needs in the community. We meet at noon on the second Sunday of each month. The Reach committee is co-chaired by Molly Norman and Robin Racoff, and the Vestry liaison is Nicole File.

In 2021, Reach had an extremely productive year of growth and service despite being in the second year of the pandemic. Parishioners truly stepped up to imagine, volunteer, organize, and act. As a result, we were able to share abundantly with a large number of our neighbors.

Our flagship accomplishment this year was starting a significant new mission to serve homeless people along with Shady Grove Baptist Church. We now serve about 3 dozen people who live primarily in the wooded areas near I-75 and the Canton Rd. Connector.

Our project began in September with delivery of 30 toiletry kits, including camp candles and full-sized bug sprays. People were especially grateful for the bug spray, which they said was "like gold."

We also delivered 50 insulated, water resistant, portable camping mats through our partnership with Softer Streets. Guests were really overcome by this gift. One man said he had been sleeping on two metal lounge chair frames – not the cushions, just the frames – to keep himself off the saturated ground during a period of heavy daily rain. He said the mat would let him sleep so much more comfortably without the metal rods digging into his body, as well as keeping him much warmer.

Another man, Scott, told us he served in Iraq and suffers from PTSD. He said he had become "intimately acquainted with every rock, root, and hole in the ground, and this will help so much." Even though we usually don't take photos of our homeless guests, Scott insisted on having his picture taken so he could keep it on his phone and show every other homeless person he meets what we are providing.



We also serve monthly hot dinners to the Shady Grove clients. We gather at ECA the 4th Wednesday of every month, prepare and individually box full hot meals, then take them to Shady Grove for dinner. We approved the expenditure of \$250 per month from our non-directed funds to pay for these meals for the last quarter of 2021. Next year we will include a line item in our budget to cover the costs. These meals provide a welcome alternative to the usual cold sandwiches that are handed out to homeless people. We have even served children at this dinner, including a little girl of about 6 who said, "I'm so excited to eat!"



Speaking of eating, our October food drive in honor of Cathy Norris set a fundraising record. We collected more than 2,800 food items and raised more than \$3,600 in monetary donations. This allowed us to write \$1,500 checks to Papa's Pantry and Never Alone. In addition, our continuous food donations were again very much appreciated by both food pantries. During one delivery, the people at Papa's Pantry said ECA "always donates the good stuff" and said our food is always high quality and based on their updated list of needs, adding that ECA should give lessons to other churches on what items to donate to a food drive.



Early in the year, Father Paul secured a \$10,000 Episcopal Relief & Development grant for Newnan, GA after an EF4 tornado devastated the town. He and Nicole File traveled to Newnan to discuss short- and long-term rebuilding plans with Rev. Hazel Smith Glover of St. Paul's Episcopal Church and other community leaders. A few weeks later, Nicole delivered about \$1,200 of supplies and gift cards to a large aid event in Newnan.





In other new ventures this year, Robin Racoff started a caregiver support group for those who are providing support for elderly or ill people. A few people meet by Zoom each month to share stories and support, as well as ideas and information for maximizing resources.

We also approved at the beginning of the year a \$2,000 emergency fund for urgent community needs. This money was used for everything from purchasing supplies for our homeless neighbors to helping a homeless former foster child, as well as a National Guard soldier who became her younger brother's guardian after their mother died. We also sent \$600 to Southern Comforters so they could absorb the higher cost of fabric and expand their ministry to take on a large new project. We aim to make this an annual budget allowance so we can be ready to serve whoever needs help.

We had one yard sale this year, which raised about \$3,000 – far above expectations during a pandemic and considering we only had one collection weekend. For the first time, we did not price items but instead, asked people to make an offer on whatever they selected. This greatly reduced the work and stress involved in preparations and did not impact our bottom line. In fact, in many cases people offered more than we would have asked. We also debuted “Surprise Boxes” at the end of the day, packing random items and selling the sealed boxes for \$2. They all sold quickly, raising a bit of money and preventing us from having to load items onto the trucks for the Salvation Army.

Other activities this year included a blanket, snack and sock drive that provided 48 blankets, dozens of pairs of socks and snack packs to Church of the Common Ground.





At the beginning of the year, Fr. Paul secured a \$10,000 ER&D COVID Grant for those who were affected by the pandemic. We attended food distribution events at Papa's Pantry and Never Alone to hand out gift cards. The gift cards could also be used to buy gas, which was highly appreciated by those who received them.

For the holidays, we funded six Thanksgiving meals, which Lainey Gaines delivered to families who needed them. Lainey also continued our Angel Tree tradition and we provided gifts for families including 5 children. Sadly, Emmaus House had to cancel its big walk and the Grandparents' Dinner this year, so we allocated the budgeted money to the toy drive instead. This meant we were able to take 3 full car/van loads of presents to Emmaus House for Christmas.



In 2022, Reach intends to continue its new homeless ministry with Shady Grove, expanding to include a permanent toiletry drive along with ECA's longstanding permanent food drive. We also intend to resume the Open Hearts summer camp, and take part in Emmaus House's Grandparents' Dinner if they hold it. We are also exploring some possibilities for new outreach to U.S. troops. Reach again plans to set aside a significant portion of the budget for urgent needs, allowing us flexibility to respond wherever God gives us an opportunity to help.

We always welcome ideas and participation in all we do!

Faith & Spirituality

The ECA Adult Christian Formation has continued to meet either virtually (due to COVID) or in person, when appropriate, at 9:30am on Sundays. Father Paul and Ron Allen lead adult CF. Attendees can choose if they prefer to meet in person or virtually, and a zoom link has been provided each week for those who choose to meet virtually. Topics have included a variety of things relevant to today's social and political climate. Children's Christian Formation has been on hold due to the COVID situation.



Education for Ministry (EFM) will continue this fall led by Katie Dunlap – with the minimum requirement of six members. We were able to celebrate our first graduates and others are welcome to be a part of EFM! Lainey Gaines will continue the Virtual Women's group, hopefully by the end of October.

Children and Youth Ministry

The ECA Youth Group is for kids 5th grade and up. Junior EYC is for youth 6th – 8th grades. Senior EYC is for youth 9th-12th grades. Typically, Children and Youth Ministry meets at least twice a month and plan activities throughout the year along with community service events that promote both fun and fellowship. Due to Covid-19, this year has been very difficult for the younger members of our parish.

The year started off at a standstill. Covid-19 took its toll on all activities. We did, however, host our annual egg hunt on Easter Sunday. Then in May we had a much-anticipated event: Cookout and game night!

As the weather warmed up the congregation started to attend other activities held outside in the newly built pavilion that included the children and youth.

Worship Ministry

- We had baptisms and funerals, and a wedding at the end of the year.

- It has been more difficult to find supply priests during the pandemic. Foster Peterson has been able to fill in when needed. Fr. Brian Sullivan filled in as a supply priest while Fr. Paul was on the

We held a full complement of Christmas services including 5:00 pm (Christmas pageant), 7:15 pm and 9:30 pm on Christmas Eve and at 10:30 am on Christmas Day. The service on the First Sunday after Christmas contained the dual blessings of a baptism and a wedding in the same service!

We have adapted to changing worship requirements (like the need to wear masks during times of increased transmission) with grace and continue to enjoy our worship together.



Servant Ministries

All Saints Sunday was our Stewardship Sunday celebration and we were able to bless and dedicate our newest space at ECA with great fellowship and food. None of the great events are possible without the dedication and love that comes from all the volunteers who make it all happen.
