

Gospel: The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ According to St. John

The customary responses before and after the Gospel are omitted. The congregation remains seated for the first part of the Passion. At the verse, which mentions the arrival at Golgotha, all stand.

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, we pray you to set your passion, cross, and death between your judgment and our souls, now and in the hour of our death. Give mercy and grace to the living; pardon and rest to the dead; to your holy Church peace and concord; and to us sinners everlasting life and glory; for with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.* 

On this day there is no dismissal.

You are invited to remain in prayer and silence for as long as you choose.

#### The Collect of the Day

Almighty God, we pray you graciously to behold this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### Station of the Cross and Good Friday Liturgy:

The Stations of the Cross- is an ancient devotion that enables us to walk with Jesus to his death. We see him condemned, carrying the cross through the streets of Jerusalem, stumbling, seeing his mother and friends, being stripped, being nailed to the cross, dying, and laid in the tomb. On this journey, we participate in Christ's passion not only with our lips, but with our hands, our eyes, our feet as well. There will be two stations, one at noon and the other at 6pm.

<u>Proper liturgy for Good Friday</u>- on this day, time nearly grinds to a halt as the church gathers to hear the proclamation of the Passion, to pray for the life of the world, and to meditate on the life-giving cross. The ancient title for this day – the triumph of the cross – reminds us that the church gathers to offer thanksgiving for the wood of the tree on which hung our salvation.

# All are invited to The Great Vigil of Easter: The First Service of Easter Day Saturday at 7:49pm

When we celebrate in the Easter Vigil, we rejoice in the day God began creation, transforming darkness into light. This is the day Jesus Christ rose from the darkness of the grave to new life. This is the day when the church celebrates its birth from the waters of baptism and its new life in the Holy Spirit. Though suffering, injustice and sin continue to mark the world in which we live, the Christian community goes forth from font and table with Christ's commission to heal, liberate and forgive. Rejoicing in the fifty days of Easter, the church also asks the question: "How does our baptism send us forth in joyful service to the world?"
