Seven Bridges was founded in 1993 as a nonprofit enterprise by Richard McKenzie to support well-known and emerging artists. Located on 80 acres in back-country Greenwich, the beautifully cultivated property is comprised of two galleries and scattered outdoor sculptures. The 1,200-piece collection includes modern and figurative paintings, fabulous glass art created by international artisans, sculptures, and photographs. "I hope visitors leave Seven Bridges with a different mindset than when they entered," notes McKenzie.
