May 8 - David Pogue, How to Prepare for Climate Change



Well-known science and technology writer David W. Pogue will offer sensible, researched advice on how we can start to ready ourselves for what's ahead in climate change. The time for bickering is long gone. The world is getting hotter, natural systems are going haywire, and we should all begin to prepare.

For his book *How to Prepare for Climate Change*, David spent a year researching the answer to a new question: How can an *individual* prepare for the coming era of chaos? This presentation should be lively, current, eye-opening, filled with surprising revelations, and ultimately uplifting!

The Manchurian Candidate is a 1962 American neonoir psychological political thriller directed and produced by John Frankenheimer. The screenplay is by George Axelrod, based on the 1959 Richard Condon novel *The Manchurian Candidate*. The film's leading actors are Frank Sinatra, Laurence Harvey, and Angela Lansbury, with co-stars Janet Leigh, Henry Silva, and James Gregory.

Out of Africa is a 1985 American epic romantic drama directed and produced by Sydney Pollack and starring Meryl Streep and Robert Redford. The film is based loosely on the 1937 autobiographical book Out of Africa written by Isak Dinesen (the pseudonym of Danish author Karen Blixen), with additional material from Dinesen's 1960 book Shadows on the Grass and other sources.
