


The Y's Women Newsletter

It received four Academy Award nominations and was ranked number 42 on the American Film Institute's "100 Years ... 100 Movies" list. The film stars James Stewart, Grace Kelly, Wendell Corey, Thelma Ritter, and Raymond Burr.

A Man on the Inside is an American comedy television series created by Michael Schur. Ted Danson stars as a retiree-turned-amateur private investigator. The cast also includes Eugene Cordero, Sally Struthers, Margaret Avery, and Susan Ruttan. It is based on the 2020 documentary film *The Mole Agent* by Maite Alberdi. The series premiered in November 2024 to critical acclaim.
