
January 22 - SIXTIES MOD: Westport Public Art **Collections** 



Join Kathie Bennewitz, Westport Town Curator, and Ive Covaci, co-chair of Westport Public Art Collections (WestPAC) to learn about the new exhibition SIXTIES MOD, part of Westport Public an ongoing collaboration WestPAC, Westport Arts Advisory

Committee, and MoCA Westport. The exhibit is on view at MoCA from January 18 to March 3. The 1960s was a pivotal decade of social, political, and

cultural upheaval continues that to resonate deeply today. Many artists became increasingly cially engaged and pushed the boundaries form, subject matter, medium, and genre. This exhibition honors an important period Westport's in



artistic history and investigates our community's ties to the broader national and international currents of the era. It also celebrates the nearly 60-year milestone when artist and educator Burt Chernow (1933-1997) began building the "Westport Art Collection," as WestPAC was first called in 1965. WestPAC's holdings are particularly strong in this pivotal era, and SIXTIES MOD features paintings, prints, drawings, and photographs created between 1955 and 1975, a period often referred to as the "long 1960s."
