### January 14

**Claudia Connor & Alicia Kinsman: Connecticut Institute for Refugees and Immigrants**

The Connecticut Institute for Refugees and Immigrants (CIRI) envisions Connecticut as a place where new Americans may fully participate in our culturally diverse communities, where low-income families may have access to affordable immigration services and be reunited with family, where survivors of crime and persecution may have the resources needed to become self-supporting and healed, and where ethnic diversity is valued as a cultural and economic strength by all.

In this presentation, Claudia Connor, President and CEO, discusses the impact on a national level of changes in refugee admissions and immigration. She has nearly 30 years of program management advocacy and legal experience in the nonprofit sector in the US, Africa, and Southeast Asia. Prior to joining CIRI

in 2015, Claudia served on Save the Children's Strategic Foundation Partnerships team. Previously, she worked as a consultant with UNICEF and the Carter Center and was a senior trial attorney for the NY Legal Aid Society. Claudia holds a BA in history from the University of North Carolina and a JD from Brooklyn Law School.

Alicia Kinsman, Director & Managing Attorney of Immigration Legal Services for CIRI, provides legal representation in immigration matters to victims of trafficking and other crimes. She speaks around the state to raise awareness of victims and immigration relief. In 2013, Alicia received an FBI Field Certification for her work in assisting medical professionals and law enforcement personnel to identify and work with foreign-born crime victims. She has a BA from Providence College and a JD from Quinnipiac University School of Law, where she co-founded the Human Rights Law Society. She will show us a short film at this presentation, followed by a Q&A.

### January 28

**Colleen Palmer, PhD: The State of the Westport School System**

As we all know, the school system is an important part of why so many people want to live in Westport. Dr. Colleen Palmer joined us as Superintendent of Schools for Westport two years ago, after five successful years in Weston and with prior experience in Monroe, Woodbury, Hamden, and Simsbury. Her vision statement says it all: "Westport Public Schools empower and inspire its students to make the world a better place." Using two of her favorite phrases – "Failure is not an option" and "Hope is not a strategy" – Colleen calls herself "tenacious and realistic" in her 24/7 job and tells people: "Dream big. My job is to remove barriers. We're all looking for better ideas and better ways to do things."

Her presentation to the Y's Women is particularly timely, following months of intense debate about

what to do about the displacement of hundreds of students by the ongoing mold issue at Coleytown Middle School. In mid-December, a plan was approved to make Westport's elementary schools K-6 beginning next year. Under the plan, all seventh and eighth graders will attend Bedford Middle

School. Claudia will bring us up to date about the Board of Education's future plans for the Westport School System. "What we do know so far is that our Westport Public Schools will remain a hallmark of excellence in education, a community of learners that cherishes every student, and a treasure of the community of Westport that we all love," she says.
