We will discuss the movies *West Side Story* and *A League of Their Own*. *West Side Story* is scheduled for broadcast at 9:00 pm on Saturday, May 27 on the WNET network of PBS as part of Reel 13 Classics. *A League of Their Own* is available on Netflix. A DVD or streaming video of both movies is also listed in the catalogs of the Westport and Fairfield libraries.

West Side Story is a 1961 American musical romantic drama, adapted from the 1957 Broadway musical of same title, which in turn was inspired Shakespeare's play Romeo and Juliet. It bv Natalie Wood, Richard Beymer, stars Tamblyn, Rita Moreno, and George Chakiris. It was nominated for 11 Academy Awards and won 10, including Best Picture (in addition to a special award for Robbins), becoming the record holder for the most wins for a musical. West Side Story is regarded as one of the greatest musical films of all time. It was designated as being "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant" by the Library of Congress and was selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry in 1997.

A League of Their Own is a 1992 American sports comedy-drama directed by Penny Marshall that tells a fictionalized account of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League (AAGPBL). It stars Tom Hanks, Geena Davis, Madonna, Lori Petty, Rosie O'Donnell, Jon Lovitz, David Strathairn, Garry Marshall, and Bill Pullman. A League of Their Own was a critical and commercial success, grossing more than \$132.4 million worldwide and garnering acclaim for

Marshall's direction and the performances of its ensemble cast. In 2012, the Library of Congress selected it for preservation in the United States National Film Registry as "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant."

Covering 15 acres, the property comprises a diverse collection of woodland and water gardens, a grass garden, raised alpine stone beds, cliff rock gardens, and an enclosed English-style flower garden.



We'll meet behind Wells Fargo bank in Trader Joe's parking lot at 9:00 am for a 9:15 departure. Directions: Take Rte. 57 north through Weston, turn left at light onto 107, then turn right at light onto Route 7. Drive north on Route 7 to Danbury, where you will take I-84 West to Newburgh, NY. Take exit 52A off I-84 onto the Taconic Parkway. Drive south on the Taconic to exit 31B and onto Rte. 301. Take Rte. 301 west for 3.5 miles. Use **Main Entrance 9** (Stonecrop Gardens), not Stonecrop Lane.

Following our two-hour tour of Stonecrop Gardens, we'll eat at 1:15 pm at Hudson Hil's Cafe & Market, 131 Main Street, Cold Spring, NY, 845-265-9471.
