April 8 – Jill Dillon: How to Win a Municipal Election When You Weren't Even Planning to Run



In this timely presentation, Jill Dillon will discuss how she entered the 2023 campaign for the Westport Board of Education less than a month before the election. Prevailed upon by many Westporters to mount a last-minute run, she assembled a team, registered to run as an unaffiliated, write-in candidate, got the word out, campaigned –

and won a seat on the Board.

Jill moved to Westport from New York City with her young family in 2012. She began volunteering at her daughters' preschool and continued as they entered the Westport Public School system. Jill served as PTA Co-President at both Kings Highway Elementary School and Coleytown Middle School. She graduated from the University of Virginia with a BS degree in Biology and a BA in French Language and Literature. Before moving to Westport to raise her family, she spent 10plus years in public opinion research, most recently as Vice President, Intellectual Property at Strategy One, a division of Edelman Public Relations. A Place in the Sun is a 1951 American drama based on the 1925 novel An American Tragedy by Theodore Dreiser. It was directed by George Stevens from a screenplay by Harry Brown and Michael Wilson, and stars Montgomery Clift, Elizabeth Taylor, and Shelley Winters. It tells the story of a working-class young man who is entangled with two women: one who works in his wealthy uncle's factory and the other a beautiful socialite. The movie was inspired by the real-life murder of Grace Brown by Chester Gillette in 1906 – resulting in Gillette's conviction and execution by electric chair in 1908.

Chinatown is a 1974 American neo-noir mystery directed by Roman Polanski from a screenplay written by Robert Towne. The film stars Jack Nicholson

and Faye Dunaway. It was inspired by the California water wars, a series of disputes over southern California water at the beginning of the 20th century, by which Los Angeles interests secured water rights in the Owens Valley.

On Friday, April 19, Carpool & Go will visit the Mattatuck Museum in Waterbury for an 11:00 am guided tour of two excellent spring shows: Sea Change/See Change and Re-Work It. Sea Change features the work of five award-winning visual artists who explore the world's oceans with a focus on the Arctic. Using a variety of media - including paintings, photos, videos, drawings, and sculptures the artists celebrate the beauty of our oceans and concerns about their degradation. Re-Work It examines the types of labor that women have to manage – from caring for one's family to earning money in the labor force. A reprisal of a small 2022 show, this exhibition incorporates a wider range of voices and perspectives and includes artwork from approximately 30 contemporary female artists.

At the end of the ramp, turn left onto South Main Street, which becomes North Main. Turn left onto West Main. After you cross Park Place, the museum will be on the right. Turn right into the entrance and drive along the side of the museum to the parking lot at the rear of the building.
