She was awarded a Danforth Fellowship and three Fulbright fellowships. The author and editor of many books, she has spoken to audiences all over the world on women and leadership.

ATTENTION, ATTENTION Must be Paid!



Susan Filan, Courtney A. George, and Suzanne B. Sutton lead practices involving women's rights at law firm Cohen & Wolf PC. In this timely presentation, they will share their

ideas, experiences, and to-dos regarding #MeToo, the internet meme that has changed the discussion around an issue that remains a societal problem today.

Coined in 2006 by social activist Tarana Burke to raise awareness of the pervasiveness of sexual abuse and assault, Me Too was a response to toxic behavior by men on women. The phrase became viral in October 2017 when *The New York Times* reported on Hollywood producer Harvey Weinstein's three-decade history of sexual harassment. Ten days later, actress Elyssa Milano, following an encounter with Weinstein, tweeted: "If you've been sexually harassed or assaulted write 'me too' as a reply to this tweet."

With the Twitter hashtag #MeToo, Milano's tweet was retweeted almost 25,000 times in the next few hours and received more than 53,000 likes. The *Times* followed up in November: "In what appears to be a seismic shift in what behavior is tolerated in the workplace, 71 high-profile men were fired or forced to resign after accusations of sexual misconduct that ranged from inappropriate comments to rape." Two weeks later the number had passed 100. In December 2017, #MeToo and its victims became *Time* Magazine's Person of the Year. Ashley Judd, Reese Witherspoon, and Megyn Kelly, among others – "The Silence Breakers" – discussed their encounters.

The presentation will include a historical discussion of the women's movement, from women's suffrage to the ongoing struggle to get the Equal Rights Amendment approved.

On Wednesday, September 4, please join Carpool and Go for an engaging and informative exhibition at the Lockwood Matthews Mansion celebrating the centennial of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution with a special exhibit, *From Corsets to Suffrage: Victorian Women Trailblazers*. This is a unique opportunity to explore the suffrage movement of the 19th and early 20th centuries and view the treasured family heirlooms of suffragists. This movement shaped the 1960s Civil Rights movement and continues to echo in today's everyday life. The show will feature rare images, objects, memorabilia, and period costumes that illustrate the activities and contributions of these women.

We will also be treated to a tour of the Mansion itself, including the newly restored second-floor bedrooms of Anna Louisa Lockwood and LeGrand Lockwood. The opulent bedroom décor, which includes an Italian marble fireplace mantle inlaid with semi-precious stones, and the full bathrooms, featuring English ceramic sink basins inset in Italian Brescia marble, capture the latest technological advances of the Gilded Age.
