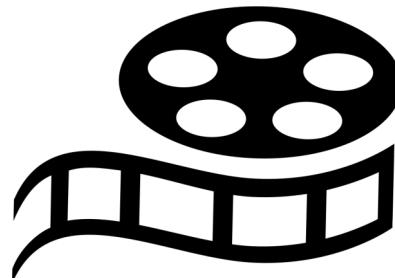
SATELLITE GROUPS (Y's Women Members Only)

We plan to discuss the *Loving* and *Forrest Gump*. Both movies are available through Netflix, and the DVDs also are listed in the catalogs of the Westport and Fairfield libraries.

Loving is an American biographical romantic drama from 2016 that tells the story of Richard and Mildred Loving, the plaintiffs in the 1967 U.S. Supreme Court (the Warren Court) decision *Loving v. Virginia*, which invalidated state laws prohibiting interracial marriage. The film takes inspiration from *The Loving Story* (2011) by Nancy Buirski, a documentary that follows the Lovings and their landmark case.

Forrest Gump is a 1994 American comedy-drama that follows the life of Forrest Gump (Tom Hanks) and his meeting with the love of his life, Jenny. The film chronicles his accidental experiences with some of the most important people and events in America from the late 1950s through the 1970s, including a meeting with Elvis Presley, JFK, Lyndon Johnson, Richard Nixon, fighting in Vietnam, etc. The problem is, Gump doesn't realize the significance of his actions. His character comes to embody a generation.

Buildings and follies were added, also with storybook names – the Celestial Pavilion and the Chinese Pavilion.
