November 9 at 11:30 am - Harold Bailey, Jr.



Harold Bailey, Jr. is Chair of TEAM Westport, the official town committee responsible for making Westport increasingly welcoming with respect to race, religion, ethnicity, and LGBTQ. He is the President of Aisha & Co. LLC, a family gift company, and former CEO of the Americas

for Show Business Software, Ltd.

He retired from his position as Vice President of Lotus Marketing Integration at IBM after 30 years in management, sales, services, marketing, strategic planning, and various leadership positions. He has been a consultant with several organizations and has served on the Board of Directors of EZ Universe.

Harold is a trustee emeritus of Brown University, his alma mater, from which he also received an honorary PhD. In addition, he is a Board member of the Westport Country Playhouse and a founding member of the Stamford chapter of 100 Black Men. He received the Anti-Defamation League's Distinguished Community Leadership award in 2005 and the George L. Plimpton Award for outstanding contribution to society from the Tilton School (New Hampshire).

November 23 at 11:30 am - David Pogue

David Pogue is an American technology and science writer and TV presenter. An Emmy-winning correspondent for *CBS News Sunday Morning*, he is also author of the "Crowdwise" column in *The New York Times'* Smarter Living section. He has hosted 18 *Nova* specials on PBS, including *NOVA ScienceNow*, the *Making Stuff* series in 2011 and 2013, and *Hunting the Elements* in 2012. David has written or co-written seven books in the *For Dummies* series (including the topics of Macintosh computers, magic, opera, and classical music).

In 1999, David launched his own series of computer how-to books called the *Missing Manual* series. This series now includes more than 100 titles covering a variety of Windows and Mac operating systems and applications. He has authored dozens of other



books as well, including *The World According to Twitter* (2009), written in collaboration with some 500,000 of his Twitter followers, and *Pogue's Basics* (2014), a *New York Times* bestseller.

Since 2012, David has served as the emcee for the annual National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences Technical and Engineering Emmys ceremony in Las Vegas.



Both movies were shown on the WNET network of PBS as part of Reel 13 Classics (*Absence of Malice* on October 10, 9:00 pm; *Dr. Strangelove* on October 17, 9:00 pm). If you did not see or record these movies, you may be able to see them through a PBS playback system (such as Thirteen Passport); other streaming service; or DVD (listed in the catalogs of the Westport and Fairfield libraries).

Absence of Malice is a 1981 American drama directed by Sydney Pollack and starring Paul Newman, Sally Field, Wilford Brimley, Melinda Dillon, and Bob Balaban. The title refers to the legal definition of one of the requirements of proof against libel defamation, which is used in journalism classes to illustrate the conflict between disclosing damaging personal information and the public's right to know.

Joe Meyers gave a fascinating lecture on October 26 on the role of movies in history, during COVID-19 times, and what we might expect in the future.

Dr. Strangelove is a 1964 black comedy that satirizes the Cold War fears of a nuclear conflict between the Soviet Union and the United States. The film was directed, produced, and co-written by Stanley Kubrick and stars Peter Sellers, George C. Scott, Sterling Hayden, and Slim Pickens. Production took place in the United Kingdom. The film is loosely based on Peter George's novel *Red Alert* (1958).

IN MEMORIAM: MARTHA AASEN



Martha Aasen, who was credited with the Westport Democratic Party's renaissance during the 1990s, died on October 23 from heart failure following a fall. She was 90.

Best known for her tenure as chairwoman of the town's Democratic Town Committee (DTC) – the first woman to hold the post – Martha was also instrumental in forming the Y's Women. She served as our organization's very first President, and had remained involved ever since. At the celebration of our organization's 25th anniversary in June 2018, Martha and Simone Dubow, our second president, shared with us the interesting story of our organization's beginnings.

Martha had a career in public relations, working for the United Nations and the International Executive Service Corp. She received the Silver Donkey Award from the Westport Democratic Women and was later credited with a town-wide turnout of 87.9% of Democratic voters in 2000. She also held numerous positions on town nonprofit boards, serving as President of the Westport Library Board of Trustees and on the boards of the Senior Center and Sunrise Rotary, among others.

Mercy Learning Center Food Drive: Nov. 4-6

Mercy Learning Center provides basic literacy and life skills education to low-income, undereducated women in our area. Using a holistic and compassionate approach, they offer accredited childcare, social services, and other support services, enabling needy women to earn high school equivalency diplomas, enhance job skills, improve their English, and prepare for citizenship exams. Their food pantry is desperately in need of replenishment, as Mercy Learning Center is the sole source of support for the students who have COVID-19 and are in quarantine. Most students and their spouses have been unable to work while others, because of the nature of their jobs, have become infected and have spread the virus to their immediate families. Many of the students are ineligible for government assistance.

The most immediate needs are:

- Canned and dried beans
- Rice
- Canned tomato sauce
- Oatmeal and cereal
- Canned fruits, vegetables, and meats
- Cooking oil
- Hand soap
- Gift cards for Stop & Shop, ShopRite, Walgreens, Target, and Kohl's
