stars Ralph Fiennes and Kristin Scott Thomas. The eponymous protagonist, a man burned beyond recognition who speaks with an English accent, recalls his history in a series of flashbacks, revealing to the audience his true identity and the love affair in which he was involved before the war.

The Thursday Murder Club is an upcoming British crime comedy directed by Chris Columbus from a screenplay by Katy Brand and Suzanne Heathcote. It is based on the 2020 novel by Richard Osman. The film stars Helen Mirren, Pierce Brosnan, Ben Kingsley, and Celia Imrie, with David Tennant, Jonathan Pryce, Naomi Ackie, Daniel Mays, Henry Lloyd-Hughes, Richard E. Grant, Tom Ellis, Geoff Bell, Paul Freeman, Sarah Niles, and Ingrid Oliver in supporting roles. Its plot follows a group of elderly amateur sleuths who attempt to solve a murder.

We start the day with a stop in Middlefield, CT at Lyman Orchard's Apple Barrel. The enticing aroma of fresh baked products fills the air throughout the market all day long. Fresh pies, apple cider, donuts, muffins, cookies, pastries, and more desserts are made in the Farm Kitchen Bakery.

From here we head to lunch at The Griswold Inn in Essex, CT. Your entrée choices: Sauteed Chicken Breast with Francaise Sauce or Pan Seared Salmon Filet with a fresh Dill Light Dijon Cream Sauce. All entrees are served with Salad, Chef's choice of Starch and Vegetable, Hot Rolls, and Dessert with freshly brewed coffee, tea, iced tea and lemonade.

It is a short ride up the street to the Essex Steam Train. There are two coal-fired locomotives that pull the collection of restored railroad cars. Be swept away with the hiss of steam, the blast of the whistle, and the clickety-clack of the tracks. The engineer shouts 'all aboard' before the run, then you sit back and experience an authentic journey back to the days of steam. Travel north from Essex Station through the scenic towns of Deep River and Chester. The train will stop at the Deep River Landing where you will disembark and board the Becky Thatcher. Her you will continue the journey north, but on the Connecticut River instead. See such sights as the famed Gillett Castle and the Goodspeed Opera House, throughout the journey learn about the history, natural wonders, and legends.

Please join us on Friday, September 19 for an excursion to Woodbury, CT to visit **Hogpen Hill Farms**, a 234-acre tree farm and landscape sculpture park with 100 artworks. "It is wild, whimsical, grand, and incredibly beautiful with sculptures ranging from stainless steel surfaces reflecting every nuance of light to lacy stone walls and silent boulder megaliths," notes Michele McDonald of the *Boston Globe. Connecticut Magazine* proclaims the site as "one of Connecticut's 30 hidden gems."

We'll meet behind the Wells Fargo Bank at Trader Joe's parking lot at 9:15 am and depart at 9:30. Since entrance to the sculpture park costs \$40 per car, it makes most sense to take four people in each vehicle. Gas reimbursement for your driver will be \$8 per person in cash.

Directions:

Take CT Rte. 136 North to Sport Hill Road, to Rte. 59 through Easton. At Rte. 25 (Main Street), turn left (north). Turn right onto Swamp Road, which becomes Botsford Hill Road, which becomes Toddy Hill Road. When you reach Rte. 34, after a LONG ride on Toddy Hill, turn left and drive to Rte. 84. Take Exit 15 off Rte. 84 onto Rte. 6/67 and drive to Woodbury. Turn left onto Rte. 47, Washington Road, then onto Rte. 132, Weekeepeemee Road (800-822-2454, 203-272-9187).

We will have lunch at 1:00 pm at **Woodbury's Marketplace Kitchen**, 641 Main Street South, Woodbury, CT (586-1215).
