September 11 – Orin Grossman: From Ragtime to Stride: American Music Comes of Age



In the 1890s, the first great American popular music craze swept the nation – ragtime. In this unique presentation, Orin Grossman, Professor Emeritus of Visual and Performing Arts at Fairfield University, begins with the music of the greatest ragtime composer, Scott Joplin. He traces the ragtime style from its beginnings to the faster,

more complex piano style of novelty piano, as demonstrated in the music of Zez Confrey and George Gershwin. He will also perform a number of Joplin's wonderful rags, Confrey's spectacular "novelty piano" piece *Kitten on the Keys*, and a number of Gershwin's most beloved songs in his own stride-influenced arrangements.

Orin has been delighting audiences the world over with his unique approach to performing and explaining great American and European music. As a performer, he is in demand as an interpreter of the music of George Gershwin, playing his songs and classical compositions around the world, including Italy, Egypt, Australia, and Russia, where he performed Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue* and gave the Russian premiere of his *Second Rhapsody* with the St. Petersburg Philharmonic to a standing ovation.

A graduate of Harvard College, Orin continued his studies at Yale University, earning a PhD in Music. After his Carnegie Hall debut recital, he performed a series of innovative recitals combining jazz, popular, and classical music. His presentations combine performance and discussion. He is a frequent star professor for "One Day University," giving talks in New York City, Philadelphia, Washington, DC, and other locales across the United States. He lectured at Tanglewood as part of the 2014 Boston Symphony Summer Season and was a featured presenter at Mexico City's *Day of Knowledge* in 2018.

Film Stars Don't Die in Liverpool is a 2017 biographical film starring Annette Bening and Jamie Bell, with a cast that includes Vanessa Redgrave and Julie Walters. Based on the memoir of the same name by Peter Turner, it describes Peter's relationship with Academy Award—winning American actress Gloria Grahame in 1970s Liverpool and, some years later, her death from stomach cancer.

Bombshell: The Hedy Lamarr Story (referred to onscreen as simply Bombshell) is a 2017 American biographical documentary about the life of actress and inventor Hedy Lamarr. The film follows her life story from her youth as the daughter of assimilated Austrian Jews through her rise to fame, the Nazi onslaught, her departure for the United States, six marriages, her acting career, her landmark invention, decline, and finally her death at the age of 85 in the year 2000. The focus of the film is on her co-creation with George Antheil of the technology of frequency hopping.
