Indy Reads Builds Community & Creates Opportunity with Support from Glick Philanthropies


INDIANAPOLIS, December 3, 2024 – Indy Reads received a \$100,000 grant from Glick Philanthropies to support their efforts to meet the rapidly growing demand for their personalized adult education classes, serving the most beginning level learner and beyond. Glick Philanthropies – a family of charitable initiatives dedicated to building community and creating opportunity that empowers every person to reach their full potential – recently announced more than \$1.86 million in grants to 40 nonprofit organizations.

The \$100,000 award will be used to support the expansion of Indy Reads' adult education programming, which, despite having served 45% more adult learners last year, saw a 95% increase in inquiries. The organization's core courses include English literacy, High School Equivalency, and workforce certifications – programming that advances equity by closing education achievement gaps and empowering adults and families to participate in and shape society.

"1 in 6 adults in our community are linguistically isolated and unable to read beyond a 5th-grade level," Ruba Marshood, Indy Reads' chief executive officer said. "As we celebrate our 40th anniversary year, we see exponential growth in inquiries for our classes, largely thanks to our learners referring us to their friends and families. We are honored by the trust our adult learners and Glick Philanthropies grant us and hold ourselves accountable to meet the needs. This award will have an immediate impact on our ability to fulfill the promise of our mission."

Glick Philanthropies awards grants to tax-exempt organizations serving central Indiana and communities where Glick Company managed properties are located. Grants support efforts to:
