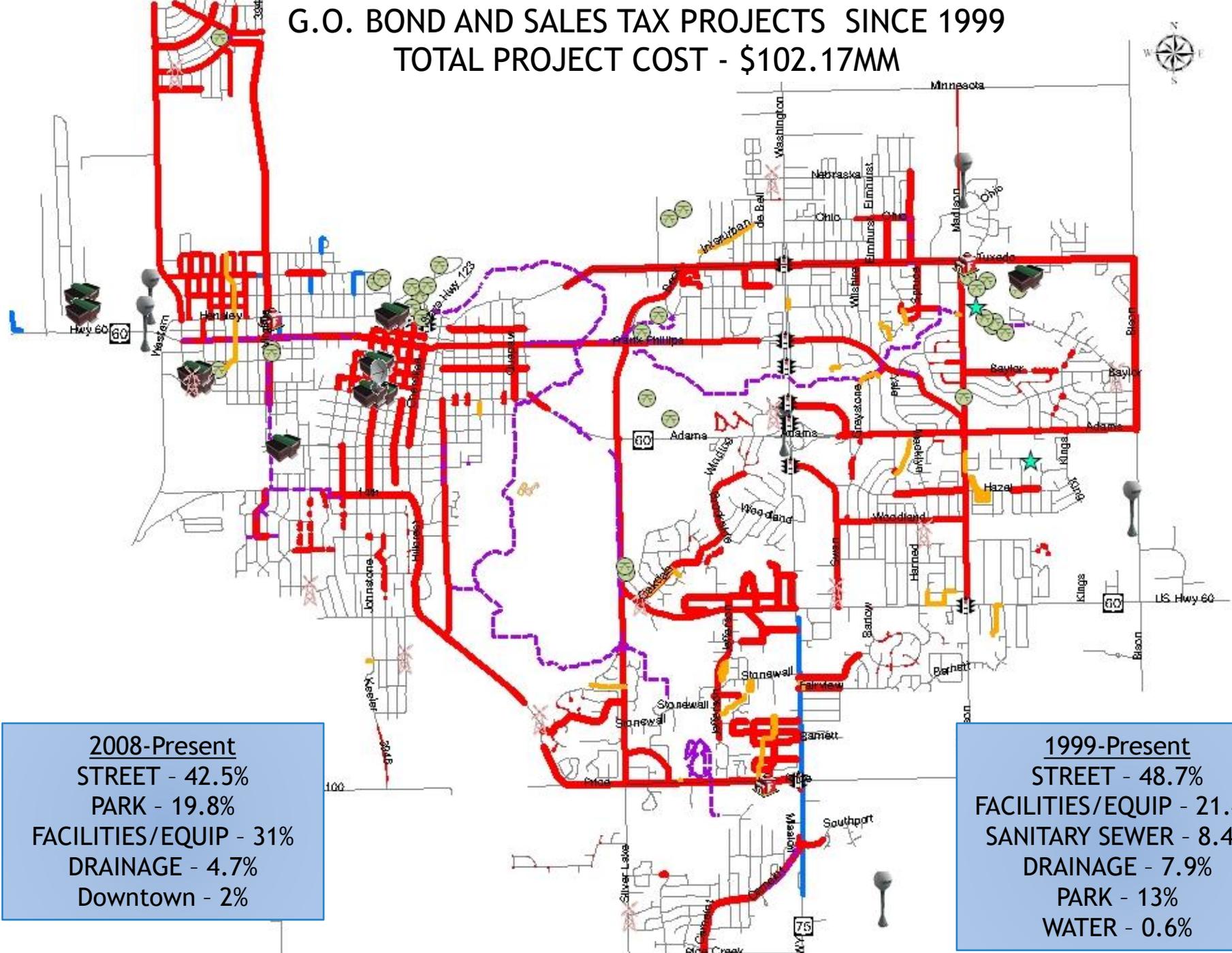

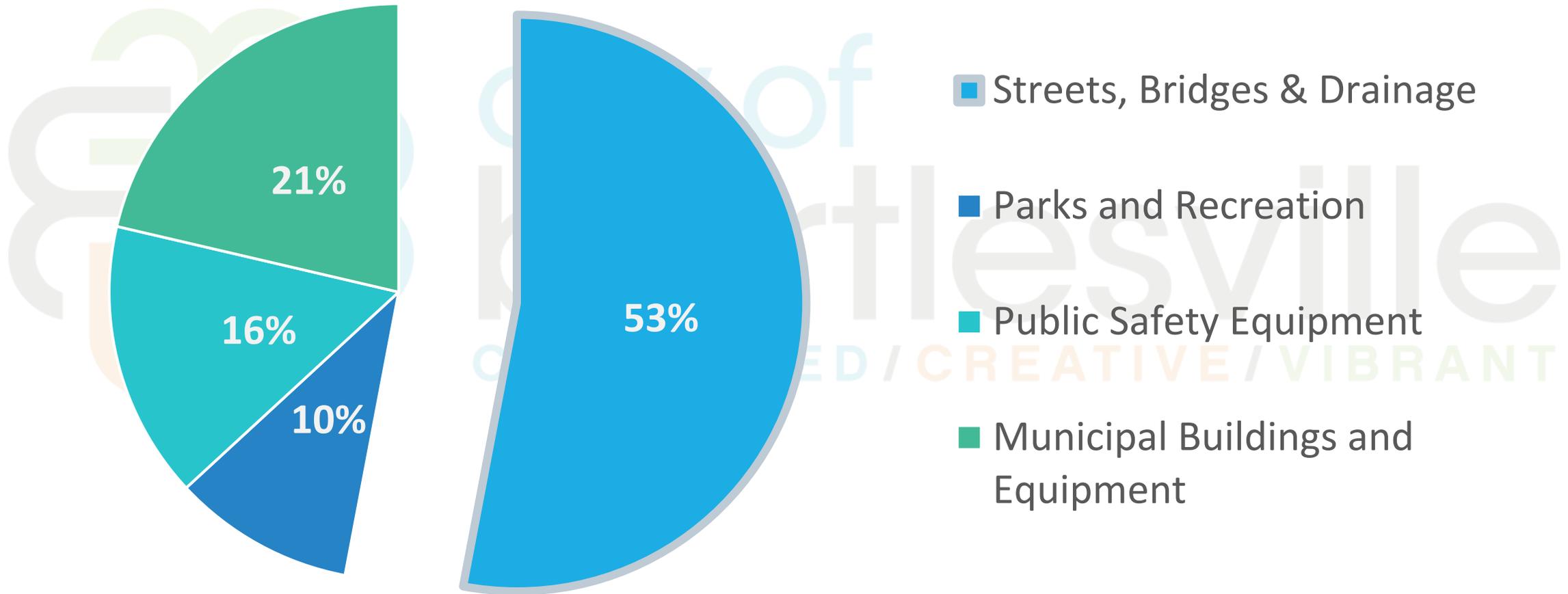

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**Resident Recruitment** -125 employees recruited to live in Bartlesville.

**Building for the Future** - All available properties sold or leased to major employers. Began construction of airport hangar, and design of large manufacturing building.

# DESTINATION MARKETING RESULTS

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## Visitor Spending Strengthens Bartlesville

Promotes Bartlesville as a destination and attracts visitors from outside the community

Supports events, tours, tournaments, and film productions

Drives visitor spending at locally owned restaurants, retail, attractions, and services

Generates sales and lodging tax revenue that reduces the tax burden on residents, approximately \$175-\$187 per household per year



**Measurable fiscal impact from visitation continues to grow: \$700K (FY23), \$764K (FY24), \$863K (FY25)**

*Tourism is economic development. Visitors help pay for the Bartlesville we all share.*
