Independence is super-important in toddlers. It comes down to children being given the confidence and self-esteem to explore alone or in a group, or to attempt something alone or with help.

Children don't have to always play with others, it is actually really important that they play alone. This is when they are understanding inner speech and they talk to themselves. When they mimic actions they have seen, or just try and figure it out first, then later explore with others. Take a moment to watch children in this kind of play, it is really fascinating. If you get the chance to just watch, stand back, and listen you will so amazed.
