"What are schemas?" you may ask. **Schemas** are described as patterns of repeated behaviour which allow children to explore and express developing ideas through their play and exploration. Infants learn best through opportunities to engage in active learning through hands on experiences.

Navigating life is no simple task, and one that can be quite the journey. As part of this journey we work to support the children in building their confidence within our room, themselves and with others. Children develop their confidence in different ways and at their own paces, this is completely normal and a process that we respect.
