Room Two has been having a blast - we have had a fantastic dress up day and fun Easter hunt.

The teachers hid some eggs for the children to find. Being teachers, we wanted to make it a little more interesting so we gave them some clues and simple instructions to follow first!! We encouraged them to look around the playground, run around the monkey bars, and down to the bottom playground – they needed to use their listening skills to find the clues! They very much enjoyed their chocolate egg reward for amazing listening.

We have also enjoyed sensory exploration with water ramps, shaving cream and small objects, lux flakes and finger painting – wow! They loved it and there has been so much conversation while exploring this kind of play.

Fine motor activities, such as gluing and sticking, construction sets and marble runs are all focused on promoting hand-eye coordination, exploring body control, balance, and understanding how things move. Determination and focus is a great outcome from these types of activities. We have definitely seen a lot of spontaneous role-play still in action, as the children explore their surroundings. We have enjoyed pretend-play with doctor sets, washing the dishes, hair dressers, dressing dolls and tea parties.

Throughout each day we promote and foster confident, strong children with lots of role modeling, encouraging children to use their words, and supporting them to keep trying until they get it right. Resilience, confidence and persistence are very strong dispositions in Room Two.
