Cornell William Brooks is Hauser Professor of the Practice of Nonprofit Organizations and Professor of the Practice of Public Leadership and Social Justice at the Harvard Kennedy School. He is also Director of the William Monroe Trotter Collaborative for Social Justice at the School's Center for Public Leadership, and Visiting Professor of the Practice of Prophetic Religion and Public Leadership at Harvard Divinity School. Brooks is the former president and CEO of the NAACP, a civil rights attorney, and an ordained minister.

Under his leadership, the Trotter Collaborative supported several statewide and national campaigns led by social justice organizations that have advanced voting rights, transformed criminal legal systems, and spearheaded reparations research and advocacy for Black Americans. In the wake of George Floyd's murder, the Trotter Collaborative partnered with eight cities to transform public safety policies and practices. In 2022, Prof. Brooks received the annual Innovations in Teaching Award from Harvard Kennedy School for his cutting edge classroom pedagogy.
