Sun., March 1, 2020 8am Depart Montgomery for Selma, AL and Brown Memorial AME Church; if space allows, we participate in worship there or at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Selma; later we gather at Brown Memorial for March through Selma and Across Edmund Pettus Bridge (memorial to Bloody Sunday); Dinner with Ms. Josephine Bolling McCall (author of *The Penalty of Success: My Father Was Lynched in Lowndes County, AL* and President of The Elmore Bolling Foundation) (overnight in Selma)

Mon., March 2, 2020 8am Depart Selma for Birmingham to visit Kelly Ingram Park; Birmingham Civil Rights Institute; 16th Street Baptist Church; Dynamite Hill; view Poor People's Campaign
3pm Depart B'ham for Fairhope
