Dear people of Holy Trintiy Church,

I regret that I cannot be with you this morning. Please know how very excited I am for you and how very proud I am of all of you as you celebrate the payoff of your church mortgage. It must have been at my very first visitation to Holy Trinity some nine years ago while meeting with your vestry, that we discussed your hope for your future and how to get there. I do not recall the details of that conversation, but I remember it involved finding a way to call a more permanent priest. Bob Graves who helped you believe in yourselves.

I hope you will take a moment, be still, look around, and let that sink in.

Once upon a time there was a man named Moses who was having a hard time believing much of anything. You know his story. And then one day while alone on a mountain, Moses saw a mysterious fire. We are told "And Moses turned aside." In that fire, to his utter amazement, Moses encountered the claim of God that freed him of his past, and the call by God into a new future.
