I look forward to working together to lead the fight for social justice in our community. We begin the new year just as we ended the last—with a call for action. Whether it is by engaging in public protests, holding elected officials accountable, registering and getting out voters or by volunteering for community service such as tutoring, assisting teens who aged out of foster care and aiding immigrants seeking asylum, we invite and encourage every member to stand up and be counted. With so much at stake in these troubling times, we hope no one will remain on the sidelines. We are all about empowering women to exercise their power.

Under its dynamic new national leadership, NCJW is beginning a new chapter. The organization is aggressively moving forward from awareness to advocacy and action with priorities that include reproductive health, rights and justice, the federal courts, voter engagement, gun violence protection, civil rights, immigration and refugees, gender-based and sexual violence. Our July protest at ICE headquarters garnered the attention of several media outlets and after our August 6th protest, I was among four representatives invited to meet with Sen. Kyrsten Sinema's chief of staff to address concerns that the senator was not speaking out against the administration's immigration policies. Our actions and visibility not only are bringing praise from National and recognition in our community but also drawing new members. Among the nearly two dozen who have joined in the last months, so many say that they are looking for a way

to channel into action their outrage and frustration over what is happening in this country. NCJW AZ is the perfect platform. Let's move forward together to expand our platform and its reach.
