The Paradox of the Sukkah

I always find the holiday of Sukkot to be the most beautiful and satisfying of all our Jewish holidays. Five days after the spiritual intensity of the High Holidays, we take the time to commune with nature. We build an intentionally precarious structure with flimsy walls and an even flimsier roof and we spend a week enjoying meals - often between raindrops - and perhaps even sleeping in the sukkah. If the weather is right - not too hot, not too cold - it can be a relaxing and rejuvenating experience.

A lesson we are supposed to learn about the Sukkah is how precarious and flimsy our life is. By building the sukkah, we recognize how dependent we are on God to sustain life. Often my sukkah is blown away by wind and rain. Often I have to rebuild it during the holiday, and sometimes if the damage is too severe, I have no choice but to take the sukkah down before the holiday ends. And yet, we build the sukkah year after year.

The sukkah is an apt metaphor for our lives. We live our lives knowing that we will encounter both joy and sadness. Some years our happiness will outweigh our despair, but there will be years when the reverse will be true. Yet we maintain our determination to go through with the rituals knowing they will provide comfort and maybe even hoping that they will be a harbinger for change.

If you've never built a sukkah - why don't you give it a try? Many websites provide easy-to-build sukkot in a variety of sizes. Most are meant for amateurs and should be relatively easy to erect. You can try this website - <https://www.sukkot.com/> - or try these creative ideas on this website here - <https://pjlibrary.org/beyond-books/pjblog/september-2017/build-a-sukkah-with-your-family> Whatever you decide to do, may the Sukkot holiday help us recognize that with our resilience and with the help of family and community we can overcome the fragile nature of our lives. With our efforts, we can build toward a happy and healthy new year.






