FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

GUN VIOLENCE

Tragically, we are becoming numb to the continued horrific incidents of mass shootings in our nation. Just last month, four more students were killed by a fellow student in a high school in Oxford, Michigan. As usual, people on both sides of the issue publicly promoted their position - either, "guns don't kill people, people do" or "institute gun control laws now."

I recently [taught a class](#) as part of my series titled "Journey Through the Jewish Year" in which I discussed the Jewish perspective on gun control. You can watch the class for more details, but essentially, as with most social justice issues, Judaism has a nuanced and practical approach. Judaism, as interpreted by the rabbis 1500 years ago, recognizes that human beings are flawed creatures. We are driven by both the "yetzer ha tov" the good inclination and the "yetzer ha rah" the evil inclination. Most of us can subdue the inherent desire to do bad and we allow religious, moral, and ethical principles to guide our decision-making. But, evil nonetheless persists in the world.

Therefore the Torah and the rabbis taught us "thou shalt not murder." They didn't teach "thou shalt not kill." The distinction is significant and crucial to understanding that we all have the right to defend ourselves and others from harm. We have the right to use force in order to protect ourselves and others from clear and imminent danger. Which means that we have the right to bear arms. Yet we have to take that responsibility seriously and cautiously. Clearly, Judaism teaches that weapons need to be out of the hands of criminals. Judaism also teaches that background checks would be essential to ensure that only mentally and emotionally sound people would be permitted to purchase a gun. And those permitted need to undergo testing in order to prove they know how to use the weapon safely and appropriately and to do that testing regularly.

These basic rules and standards are in force in most countries around the world. These laws don't prevent people from owning guns, but they do ensure that people are safe and secure. All laws restrict behavior. But by doing so these laws ensure that we are free to pursue our basic right to "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." In looking back at some of the thoughts that I've shared in this column, I noticed that occasionally I comment on national and world affairs, and not in a positive way, but more of a request for all of us to overcome differences and treat each other with respect.

Believe me, I could probably find more and more examples each month to write about. But, let's skip that for now. Instead let's focus on a place where people can leave any negative feelings behind, perhaps from all of these ills that I've mentioned.

Think about the word **sanctuary**. If you look up the word sanctuary, you'll find language like "a place where someone or something is protected." Or said another way "the protection that is provided by a safe place." Two words are predominant in every definition – **safe** and **protected**.

So it should come as no surprise that another use of the word sanctuary is "the room inside a church, synagogue, etc., where religious services are held." I hope that resonates with you the way that it resonates with me. Think about it, when we come to shul, we're safe and protected. And that's the place where we worship.

I'd like to expand that even further. Even when you come to our building for purposes other than services, don't you feel the same way, safe and protected? It's not just the room that we call the sanctuary, it's the entire building! Maybe it's just a sense of pride, or a special place away from home, but there's definitely a positive feeling.

And even further than that, because of Covid-19 many of our services are held on ZOOM. Yet, somehow when you're logging in from home to one of our services, I bet that you somehow feel the same way.

I don't know if the feeling of being safe and protected in our building is some type of divine intervention (I think not), but instead I think that it has more to do with the congregation of people who genuinely care about others, and "practice random acts of kindness and senseless acts of beauty."

I am so very fortunate to be a part of our congregation.

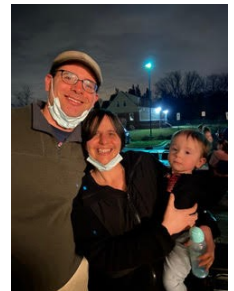

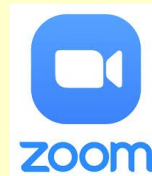
