FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY RABBI JONAH LAYMAN

עבדים היינו...עתה בני חורין -
We Were Slaves (in Egypt)...Now We Are Free

The line above is a central theme of our Passover seder. The Haggadah's focus is to recount the dramatic events in Egypt over 3,000 years ago in song, prayer, and story, and it all revolves around God's miraculous intervention in our history. God heard our cries in Egyptian servitude and sent Moses and Aaron to Pharaoh in order to free us and lead us to the Promised Land.

Though the observance of Passover today can be narrowly understood as a celebration and commemoration of the Exodus 3,300 years ago, most rabbis over the centuries and most modern Haggadot understand the pursuit of freedom more globally and metaphorically. We understand that our freedom requires us to advocate for the freedom of all people from persecution and oppression. When a segment of our community is discriminated against and suffers persecution, we are called to help them overcome it. When a country is attacked we are duty-bound to protect it.

And when we as individuals suffer - due to a physical, mental, or emotional ailment - we pray and strive to be free. When we are ill, when we are under duress, when we are in pain we feel as if we are enslaved - stuck without hope to be free. We long for the day when we can breathe freely again.

How can we overcome? We look to God for strength and guidance. God may not directly intervene in our lives and miraculously cure us, but we can pray to God for the support and comfort we need. We can reach out to family, friends, and the community for help and assistance.

There is tremendous suffering in the world around us. The Haggadah's reminder of the miracle 3,300 years ago is a call to us to do our best to help ourselves and others to experience the miracle of freedom, in whatever form it can take. May this Passover holiday be the beginning of that process.

Now we're faced with realities. The Coronavirus, Ukraine, inflation, and the price of gas (and everything else). Meeting by Zoom or in person. And a host of other issues. Over the past seven months, we had to replace our executive director, we've focused on monetizing the cemetery property that we own off of Adelphi Road, we're moving forward with leasing our classrooms to a long-term tenant. It seems that every month there's something new. And yet somehow, despite distractions, major issues, interruptions in our daily routines, etc., I find the congregation resilient. No, operations are not entirely normal; but we've managed to continue our routines of services, school, events, etc. Everyone should be immensely proud of our organization, our staff, and our clergy.

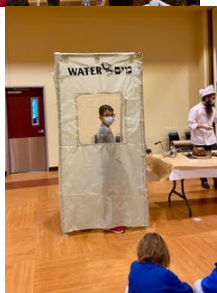


Can you believe that it is already April? The flowers are sprouting and blooming, trees are budding with our area cherry trees past their peak already - every year I am amazed by the strength these delicate blooms demonstrate, holding onto their branches when the winds blow. **Our synagogue community has continued to demonstrate the same level of strength during the past two years, and the resilience of the children of Shaare Tefila has been remarkable.**

The resilience I mentioned above was evident at our Erev Purim Megillah reading, as all the children in grades 3 and up led the festivities, in front of a full Sanctuary! Each of them read his or her verses with a great deal of enthusiasm and brought joy to everyone present, whether in person, over zoom, or on our live stream. The holiday celebration continued that Sunday with a fun-filled Purim Carnival in the Front Yard, where games were played, hot dogs were eaten, and prizes were won.



Passover at Chavaya! Everyone began to get into the holiday spirit at our last Sunday session in March. Each class started its individual holiday lessons, then gathered to create ritual items that can be used on their family seder table: a matzah cover and a seder plate. All the children got to experience the Matzah Factory with our friend from JCrafts, where they learned about the harvesting and grinding of the wheat for flour, as well as how the flour and water are mixed for the dough. Each child was able to roll out a piece of dough and make the holes in the piece before taking it home to bake. **April 3** will be our last Chavaya session before Montgomery County spring break and the beginning of Passover, so classes will conclude their holiday lessons then. **Everyone will return to Chavaya on Sunday, April 24.**

SELL YOUR CHAMETZ

The main ritual of Passover preparation is ridding our homes of all grain and leavened products (*chametz*). To actually throw out our food would be wasteful. The rabbis 1500 years ago devised a legal fiction that would permit us to leave the food in our homes. By selling the *chametz* to someone not obligated to observe the holiday, we fulfill the commandment “do not have *chametz* in your possession.”

*In order to “sell” your chametz, complete the form below and return it to Rabbi Layman by Friday morning April 15, 2022. When “selling” our chametz, it is customary to make a donation called *ma’ot chitim* to enable those who are poor to celebrate Passover. All monies will be donated to MAZON: The Jewish Response to Hunger.*

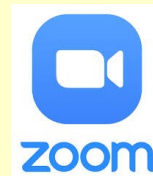
