DRAFT SUMMARY

91ST Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting Thursday, April 23, Friday, April 24 and Saturday, April 25

The 2026 NFL Draft presented by Bud Light will be broadcast live on NFL Network, ABC, ESPN, ESPN Deportes and streamed on NFL+. The New England Patriots hold 11 selections in the draft. The Patriots selected 11 players in the 2025 NFL Draft. It marked the 12th time since 2000 that the Patriots made 10 or more selections in a single draft (2000, '01, '03 '06, '09, '10, '15, '19, '20, '22, '23 and '25). With the 11 picks, the Patriots are tied with Baltimore, Miami and Jacksonville, behind only Pittsburgh (12) for the most picks entering the 2026 Draft.

UNDERCLASSMEN ELIGIBLE FOR 2026 DRAFT

The National Football League has announced the names of 42 players who have been granted special eligibility for the 2026 NFL Draft. Each of the 42 players has met the league's three-year eligibility rule and each has submitted a written application in which he renounced his remaining college football eligibility. The deadline for receiving applications was Jan. 14, 2026.

ROUND-BY-ROUND ROTATION

The draft order of teams with identical records will rotate by round, with the exception of the Super Bowl champion and the Super Bowl runner-up, which will draft last and next-to-last in each round. In ties that involve three or more teams, the team at the bottom of the tied segment in a given round will move to the top of the segment for the next round, while all other teams in the segment move down one position. This rotation continues throughout the draft.

DRAFT ORDER

The NFL's 2026 draft order was derived from the reverse order of 2025 regular season records, with the exception of the Super Bowl champion, the Super Bowl runner-up and the playoff teams. Teams that made the playoffs are ordered by which round of the playoffs they are eliminated. For teams with identical records, the tiebreaker is strength of schedule; the team with the lowest strength of schedule drafts first. The final tiebreaker is a coin flip.

PASSING ON A SELECTION

If a team does not make a pick during its allotted time period, the team "passes" and the pick will defer to the next team. The initial team may then at any point make a pick, regardless of whether or not the subsequent team has made a pick.

COMPENSATORY DRAFT CHOICES

A total of 32 compensatory choices in the 2026 NFL Draft have been awarded to 15 teams, but the Patriots were not among them. One 2026 special compensatory draft selection was awarded to Detroit and traded to Jacksonville for a minority hiring. The Patriots have been awarded a total of 48 compensatory selections in the 33 years since the system was adopted prior to the 1994 draft, the sixth-most in the NFL.

Numbers and Positioning: The number of picks a team receives equals the net loss of compensatory free agents, with a maximum of four. The compensatory picks are positioned within the third through seventh rounds, based on the value of the compensatory free agents lost.

Formula: Compensatory free agents are determined by a formula based on salary, playing time and postseason honors. The formula was developed by the NFL Management Council. Details can be found at www.nflcommunications.com.

2026 NFL DRAFT: BY THE NUMBERS

The number of draft-day trades the Patriots made in 2004. It is the only year since 2000 that New England has not engaged in any draft-day trades.

2

2025 was the second year in a row that the Patriots used their first four draft picks on offensive players. In 2024, the Patriots used their first five draft picks on the offensive side of the ball. Prior to that the Patriots last started a draft with four straight offensive players in 2006 and 2000.

3

The three draft-day trades with the L.A. Rams in 2019 are the most with a single team in team history. It is the most draft-day trades between two teams since Dallas and Cleveland had three draft-day trades in 2007. The Patriots previously traded twice with Detroit in 2018, Green Bay in 2012, Baltimore in 2009, Oakland in 2007 and Detroit in 2001. The only other time in team history that the Patriots had multiple trades with a team was two with San Francisco in the 1982 draft.

The Patriots have drafted at least one wide receiver in five straight drafts after the team selected WR Kyle Williams in the third round in 2025.

2026 NFL DRAFT: BY THE NUMBERS

15

Since 2000, the Patriots have used 15 draft selections on the quarterback position, beginning first with Tom Brady in the sixth round (199th overall) in the 2000 NFL Draft. It is the most among all NFL teams during that time. Since 2010, the Patriots have drafted 10 quarterbacks for the most in the NFL. Overall, the Patriots have drafted 50 quarterbacks in team history.

The Patriots drafted two players from Alabama with their first two picks in 2021 and then their next two picks on two players from Oklahoma. It was the 14th and 15th time since 2000 that the Patriots selected at least two players from one school in a single draft and the first time in team history to make back-to-back picks from one school followed by back-to-back picks from another school in four consecutive selections. Since 1970, the only other team to have two picks from one school followed by their next two picks from another school was the 1992 Los Angeles Rams, who drafted DE Sean Gilbert (Pittsburgh) in the first round followed by DB Steve Israel (Pittsburgh) in the second round and then used two third-round picks for Marc Boutte (LSU) and WR Todd Kinchen (LSU).

The Patriots drafted LB Bradyn Swinson in the fifth round out of Louisiana State in 2025. With the selection of Will Campbell in the first round from Louisiana State, it marked the 17th time since 2000 that the Patriots drafted at least two players from the same school and first since the 2023 season when they drafted P Bryce Baringer in the sixth round and CB Ameer Speed in the sixth round out of Michigan State. |

Since 1960, the Patriots have drafted 24 players from Michigan in their draft history, more than any other school. Boston College is second all-time with 23 players.

HISTORY OF #31 (FIRST ROUND)

PATRIOTS AT #31: The Patriots have made two selections with the 31st pick overall, drafting **LB Chris Slade** out of Virginia in 1993 and **RB Sony Michel** in 2018 out of Georgia. Slade ranks in the top five all-time in franchise history for both sacks and forced fumbles and earned a Pro Bowl nod following his 1997 campaign. Michel played three seasons in New England and played a major role in the team's run to the Super Bowl title in 2018.

NOTABLE PICKS: The 31st selection produced four-time Pro Bowl center **Travis Frederick** (Dallas) from the 2013 draft, two-time Pro Bowl running back **Doug Martin** (Tampa Bay) in 2012 and three-time Pro Bowl tight end **Greg Olsen** (Carolina) from the 2007 draft. Other notables at No. 31 include line-backer **Roman Phifer** (L.A. Rams) from the 1991 draft, who would go on to win three Super Bowl titles as a Patriot from 2001-2004.
