DRAFT SUMMARY

90th Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting

Thursday, April 24, Friday, April 25 and Saturday, April 26

The 2025 NFL Draft presented by Bud Light will be broadcast live on NFL Network, ABC, ESPN, ESPN Deportes and streamed on NFL+. The New England Patriots hold nine selections in the draft. The Patriots enter the 2025 draft with the fourth pick overall. Since 1970, the Patriots have made a selection in the Top-Five nine times: 1970 (4), 1971 (1), 1973 (4), 1976 (5), 1982 (1), 1984 (1), 1993 (1), 1994 (4) and 2024 (3). The Patriots have owned the fourth overall pick three times, in 1970, 1973 and 1994, selecting DT Phil Olsen out of Utah State in 1970, Pro Football Hall of Fame G John Hannah out of Alabama in 1973 and Patriots Hall of Fame LB Willie McGinest out of USC in 1994.

ROUND-BY-ROUND ROTATION

The draft order of teams with identical records will rotate by round, with the exception of the Super Bowl champion and the Super Bowl runner-up, which will draft last and next-to-last in each round. In ties that involve three or more teams, the team at the bottom of the tied segment in a given round will move to the top of the segment for the next round, while all other teams in the segment move down one position. This rotation continues throughout the draft.

DRAFT ORDER

The NFL's 2025 draft order was derived from the reverse order of 2024 regular season records, with the exception of the Super Bowl champion, the Super Bowl runner-up and the playoff teams. Teams that made the playoffs are ordered by which round of the playoffs they are eliminated. For teams with identical records, the tiebreaker is strength of schedule; the team with the lowest strength of schedule drafts first. The final tiebreaker is a coin flip.

PASSING ON A SELECTION

If a team does not make a pick during its allotted time period, the team "passes" and the pick will defer to the next team. The initial team may then at any point make a pick, regardless of whether or not the subsequent team has made a pick.

COMPENSATORY DRAFT CHOICES

A total of 35 compensatory choices in the 2025 NFL Draft have been awarded to 16 teams. The Patriots have been awarded a total of 48 compensatory selections in the 32 years since the system was adopted prior to the 1994 draft, the fifth-most in the NFL.

Numbers and Positioning: The number of picks a team receives equals the net loss of compensatory free agents, with a maximum of four. The compensatory picks are positioned within the third through seventh rounds, based on the value of the compensatory free agents lost.

Formula: Compensatory free agents are determined by a formula based on salary, playing time and postseason honors. The formula was developed by the NFL Management Council. Details can be found at www.nflcommunications.com.

2025 NFL DRAFT: BY THE NUMBERS

0

The number of draft-day trades the Patriots made in 2004. It is the only year since 2000 that New England has not engaged in any draft-day trades.

3

The three draft-day trades with the L.A. Rams in 2019 are the most with a single team in team history. It is the most draft-day trades between two teams since Dallas and Cleveland had three draft-day trades in 2007. The Patriots previously traded twice with Detroit in 2018, Green Bay in 2012, Baltimore in 2009, Oakland in 2007 and Detroit in 2001. The only other time in team history that the Patriots had multiple trades with a team was two with San Francisco in the 1982 draft.

The Patriots have selected four Division II players in the draft since 2000 - Kyle Dugger (2020), Sam Roberts (2022), Zach Moore (2014) and Andy Stokes (2005).

The Patriots enter the 2025 draft with four selections inside the top 100. The last time the Patriots made four picks within the first 100 was in 2020: S Kyle Dugger (37), LB Joshua Uche (60), LB Anfernee Jennings (87) and TE Devin Asiasi (91).

The Patriots have drafted a quarterback in the first round five times overall since 1970 - **Jim Plunkett** from Stanford (1st overall in 1971), **Tony Eason** from Illinois (15th overall in 1983), **Drew Bledsoe** from Washington State (1st overall in 1993), **Mac Jones** from Alabama (15th overall in 2021) and **Drake Maye** from North Carolina (4th overall in 2024).

The Patriots enter the 2025 draft with the fourth pick overall. Since 1970, the Patriots have made a selection in the Top-5 nine times: 1970 (4), 1971 (1), 1973 (4), 1976 (5), 1982 (1), 1984 (1), 1993 (1), 1994 (4) and 2024 (3).

Since 2000, the Patriots have selected a player from the Southeastern Conference in the first round nine times.

The Patriots have drafted in the Top-5 nine times in team history and have held the fourth overall pick three previous times - (1970-QB Phil Olsen, 1973 - G John Hannah and 1994 - LB Willie McGinest).

The New England Patriots have drafted at least one offensive lineman in 11 straight drafts (2014-24).

The Patriots have drafted 13 offensive linemen in the first round in team history, the most among all positions with 12 defensive backs as the second-most drafted position in the first round.

13

The Patriots have had back-to-back picks 13 times since 1970, most recently in 2011.

15

Since 2000 the Patriots have used 15 draft selections on the quarterback position, beginning first with Tom Brady in the sixth round (199th overall) in the 2000 NFL Draft. It is the most among all NFL teams during that time. The Patriots have two drafted quarterbacks on the roster with the 2024 first-round pick Drake Maye and 2024 sixth-round pick Joe Milton III. Since 2010, the Patriots have drafted nine quarterbacks for the most in the NFL. Overall, the Patriots have drafted 50 quarterbacks in team history.

15

The Patriots drafted two players from Alabama with their first two picks in 2021 and then their next two picks on two players from Oklahoma. It was the 14th and 15th time since 2000 that the Patriots selected at least two players from one school in a single draft and the first time in team history to make back-to-back picks from one school followed by back-to-back picks from another school in four consecutive selections. Since 1970, the only other team to have two picks from one school followed by their next two picks from another school was the 1992 Los Angeles Rams who drafted DE Sean Gilbert (Pittsburgh) in the first round followed by DB Steve Israel (Pittsburgh) in the second round and then used two third-round picks for Marc Boutte (LSU) and WR Todd Kinchen (LSU).

Since 1960, the Patriots have drafted 24 players from Michigan in their draft history, more than any other school. Boston College is second all-time with 23 players.

The number of defensive players New England has drafted in the first round since 1970, the modern era of the NFL. The Patriots have drafted 11 defensive players in the first round since 2000.

In 1973, the Patriots selected Pro Football Hall of Fame G John Hannah out of Alabama and then in 1970 the team selected DT Phil Olsen out of Utah State.

NOTABLE PICKS: The 4th overall selection in 2004 was used by the New York Giants on QB Philip Rivers. Rivers was traded to the Chargers and in 17 NFL seasons he ranks sixth in passing yards. In 1999, Indianapolis used the fourth pick on Pro Football Hall of Famer RB Edgerrin James. He ranks 13th all-time on the NFL's rushing list.
