## Gospel: Luke 16:1-13

Then Jesus said to the disciples, “There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. So he summoned him and said to him, ‘What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer.’ Then the manager said to himself, ‘What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.’ So, summoning his master’s debtors one by one, he asked the first, ‘How much do you owe my master?’ He answered, ‘A hundred jugs of olive oil.’ He said to him, ‘Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.’ Then he asked another, ‘And how much do you owe?’ He replied, ‘A hundred containers of wheat.’ He said to him, ‘Take your bill and make it eighty.’ And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes.

“Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.”

Sustainer and giver of life, you bless this congregation with abundance. As the crowd gathered to hear Jesus preach, shared two fish and five loaves, they discovered that when their gifts were blessed, they increased and became a blessing to others. We give you thanks for the uncountable miracles and blessings in our lives. (*Silence may be kept for a time.*) Instruct us in the proper and faithful use of wealth and resources, that we share generously. God of grace,  
**hear our prayer.**

*Here other intercessions may be offered.*

God of glory, you gather your saints around your throne. Keep us thankful for the witness of those who have gone before us, especially the members of our Legacy Society whose gifts, bequests, and intentions provide inspiration and abundance beyond their lifetimes, and bring us with them to the heavenly feast that has no end. God of grace,  
**hear our prayer.**

**Covid Level YELLOW — Masks optional** but strongly encouraged for those with elevated risk: those over 65, those with weakened immune systems, or those at high risk for severe illness. We have been following the CDC's guidance for masking recommendations based on Covid-19 Community Levels. The Community Level in Lehigh and Northampton counties is now MEDIUM, or level YELLOW. At this level, people may mask at any time but masks are optional when within the Cathedral buildings.
