You just pay a two percent administrative fee for all gifts received, and you can link directly to the giving portal from your website. [Canva Pro account for online graphic editing](#). By providing your non-profit paperwork, Canva offers a free pro account for churches, giving you access to all of their templates, stock icons and images. Even if you don't have a creative bone in your body, Canva makes it easy to create images that look great on social media, bulletin covers, slide shows, websites, and more.

[Adobe Express](#) offers free professionally-designed templates for all social media platforms. You can customize designs with your desired fonts and colors or drag and drop from Adobe's library of free images, icons, and graphics.

[Google Workspace for Nonprofits for email, file storage, and unlimited online meetings](#). This is free for nonprofits. Simply apply for eligibility through Google by showing 501(c)(3) status and Google will offer you a free domain name supported through Gmail (pastor@churchname.com). A word to the wise: match your email domain name to your website, and keep it as simple as you can — the less required spelling the better! Google Workspace for Nonprofits also comes with 30 GB of storage per account user, free access to Google Meet (video meetings for up to 100 users), and security and management controls. A nonprofit Google account allows you to share documents easily (Google Drive), access data from anywhere (storage on the cloud), and share meetings (Google Calendar).

[Google Ad Grants](#) provides access to \$10,000 USD of in-kind advertising every month for text ads. [Read here](#) to learn more about the Google Ad grants.

[Mailchimp](#) has a free version for up to 2,000 contacts. So it is more than sufficient for a smaller church. Plus, Mailchimp subscribe forms can be easily integrated into most web platforms, allowing users to subscribe directly to your email list from your church website. Once you create an email template for your church newsletter, you can easily update it each week or month to send users your announcements and events. Mailchimp even creates a unique URL for each email content, making it easy to share.

[TechSoup](#) is a gateway to accessing cutting-edge IT software and products at affordable prices. To set up your account, you will need to produce your 501(c)(3) paperwork from the denomination and individual church. Once you do that, you can get great discounts on everything from popular software such as the Microsoft Office suite and Quickbooks licenses to hardware such as laptops and desktop computers. They also offer free “how to” courses with many products. Before you say something is too expensive for your church to afford, always check TechSoup first; it has allowed churches to utilize technology at a reasonable cost while continuing to direct money towards ministry and mission.
