



Crayola® Model Magic® Slime

SUPPLIES

- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup Crayola® No-Run School Glue (approx. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ bottles)
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup Crayola® Model Magic®
- 1/8 tsp. baking soda
- 1 Tbsp. lotion
- 3 tsp. contact lens solution*
- 1/8 cup water
- Mixing bowl
- Craft stick or spoon
- Newspaper or craft paper (to protect surface)



STEPS

1. Pour $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of Crayola® No-Run School Glue, 1/8 tsp. of baking soda, and 1 Tbsp. of lotion into a mixing bowl. With a craft stick or spoon, mix well until all of the ingredients are completely mixed in.
2. Add contact solution in $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp increments. Mix the contact solution in each time it is added until 3 tsp. have been added or until the slime is easily coming off the bowl. **NOTE:** It is important to not add too much contact solution to the slime mixture because it can cause the slime to become very stiff. Once all the contact solution is added, your glue mixture should have a slime-like consistency.
3. In another bowl add $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of Crayola® Model Magic® and 1/8 cup of water and mix together until the model magic has started to dissolve and mixes well with the water. **NOTE:** There may be excess water, which you are able to add to the overall mix.
5. Once you have both mixtures, add them together either stirring or kneading them together until you have a smooth and well mixed slime.
6. To keep the slime from drying out keep it in a sealable plastic bag or air-tight container.

**Adult supervision is required; This project is not appropriate for children under the age of 3 years. If large quantities of contact lens solution are accidentally ingested (greater than a tablespoon), get medical attention immediately*



Crayola® Glitter Glue Sparkle Slime

SUPPLIES

- 4 oz. Crayola® Glitter Glue
(1-4 oz. bottle or 12 0.33 oz. tubes)
- 1-1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 Tbsp. contact lens solution*
- Mixing bowl
- Craft stick or spoon
- Newspaper or craft paper (to protect surface)



STEPS

1. Pour 4 oz. of Crayola® Glitter Glue and 1 ½ tsp. of baking soda into a mixing bowl, mixing well until all of the baking soda is completely mixed in.
2. Add 1 Tbsp. contact solution and mix. Contact solution will give your glue mixture a slime-like consistency
NOTE: If the mixture is too sticky, add a tiny amount of contact solution. It is important to not add too much contact solution to the slime mixture because it can cause the slime to become very stiff.
3. Continue stirring or kneading together until you have a smooth and well mixed slime.
4. To keep the slime from drying out keep it in a sealable plastic bag or air-tight container.


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Crayola® Watercolor Pastel Slime

SUPPLIES

- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup Crayola® No-Run School Glue (approx. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ bottles)
- Crayola® Watercolor Paints
- $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. baking soda
- 1 Tbsp. lotion
- 3 tsp. contact lens solution*
- 2 oz. warm water
- Mixing bowl
- Craft stick or spoon
- Newspaper or craft paper (to protect surface)



STEPS

1. Pour $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of Crayola® No-Run School Glue, $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. of baking soda, and 1 Tbsp. of lotion into a mixing bowl. With a craft stick or spoon, mix well until all of the ingredients are completely mixed in.

2. Add 2-3 individual Crayola® Watercolor Paint tablets to 2 oz. warm water, and stir until completely dissolved. Add as much of this coloring to your slime mixture.

3. Add contact solution in $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. increments. Mix the contact solution in each time it is added until 3 tsp. have been added or until the slime is easily coming off the bowl. **NOTE:** It is important to not add too much contact solution to the slime mixture because it can cause the slime to become very stiff. Once all the contact solution is added, your glue mixture should have a slime-like consistency.

4. Continue stirring or kneading together until you have a smooth and well mixed slime.

5. To keep the slime from drying out keep it in a sealable plastic bag or air-tight container.

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Crayola® Marker Marbleized Slime



SUPPLIES

- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup Crayola® No-Run School Glue (approx. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ bottles)
- Crayola® Markers
- 1/8 tsp. baking soda
- 1 Tbsp. lotion
- 3 tsp. contact lens solution*
- Mixing bowl
- Craft stick or spoon
- Newspaper or craft paper (to protect surface)

STEPS

1. Pour $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of Crayola® No-Run School Glue, 1/8 tsp. of baking soda, and 1 Tbsp. of lotion into a mixing bowl. With a craft stick or spoon, mix well until all of the ingredients are completely mixed in.
2. Add contact solution in $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. increments. Mix the contact solution in each time it is added until 3 tsp. have been added or until the slime is easily coming off the bowl. **NOTE:** It is important to not add too much contact solution to the slime mixture because it can cause the slime to become very stiff. Once all the contact solution is added, your glue mixture should have a slime-like consistency.
3. Continue stirring or kneading together until you have a smooth and well mixed slime.
4. Remove your slime mixture from bowl and add dots with Crayola® Markers. Fold slime together to create a marbleized effect.
5. To keep the slime from drying out keep it in a sealable plastic bag or air-tight container.

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
