Dear Michigan School Administrators:

As you may already know, a package of bills to enhance school safety recently became law. The new laws will help school districts and local law enforcement work together to ensure stable learning environments for Michigan's students.

We want to personally make sure you and your colleagues are aware of the new requirements that impact the information you are required to provide to OK2SAY, Michigan's student safety program. [OK2SAY](#) is a prevention-based reporting system designed to facilitate tip sharing among students, parents, school personnel, community mental health service programs, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, and law enforcement officials. Part of the new law requires every school to provide the Department of State Police (MSP) with emergency contact information twice a year. Specifically:

- [Public Act 670 of 2018](#) requires every public and nonpublic school to provide MSP at least one school official's emergency contact information twice a year. Ideally, each school should register the school's contact information by June 1st and September 1st. This emergency after-hours contact information will allow OK2SAY technicians to efficiently communicate with school personnel about potential harm or criminal activities directed at school students, school employees, and schools. The contact information is kept confidential and only is accessed if there is an after-hours emergency involving imminent danger to the safety or well-being of a student.

As school administrators, you play a key role in establishing and maintaining safe and healthy learning environments. Your leadership reassures students, staff, and parents that our schools are safe places for children. Thank you for all you do. Together we will continue to do everything in our power to keep your students safe.
