Re: Business Operations Not Necessary to Sustain or Protect Life

Michigan's Governor recently issued Executive Order 2020-21 (Stay Home, Stay Safe) starting March 24, 2020 at 12:01 am, and continuing through April 13, 2020 at 11:59 pm. The focus of this Executive Order is the temporary requirement to suspend activities that are not necessary to sustain or protect life. The City has recently received inquiries related the sale of retail goods in the downtown business district under this Executive Order. The City is advising any retail business owner that needs clarification regarding if their business operations are classified as "necessary to sustain or protect life" under Executive Order 2020-21, to contact the State of Michigan directly.

A Saugatuck City Sheriff Deputy will be notified to investigate.
