

His collaborations have included the Partnership for LA Schools and the Arts for Healing and Justice Network, as well as working within the Los Angeles Unified School District and the Los Angeles County Probation System. Gavin has presented these programs, their curricula, and best practices for this work on a national level, supporting other organizations in making a positive impact through music education.

## Social Justice Collection MARCH 2024



Support for Harbor Area Women's Lives (SHAWL) is a four-month residential recovery program for homeless, addicted women who are survivors of domestic violence (currently 13 women). SHAWL provides comprehensive services and treatment in a warm and supportive atmosphere for women who are attempting to end their addiction, live a life free from violence, and become self-sufficient. SHAWL gives the women an opportunity to improve their life and educational skills, time to explore destructive behavior patterns and learn new decision-making skills in order to work toward stability as well as independence in their lives.

Three facilities in San Pedro provide temporary housing and supportive services for women. SHAWL's Executive Director is UUCLB member Laurie Whalen-Martinez. Visit the SHAWL website: www.shawlwomenshouse.org

#### 8th Principle Scholarships

## Unitarian Universalist Church Of Long Beach - Policy For 8th Principle Scholarships To District, Regional, And General Assemblies (Excerpt)

The 8th Principle Scholarship Application - Contact Kathy Adams at katole@uuclb.org for information

In keeping with the 8th Principle and Widening the Circle of Concern, 8th Principle Scholarships will be awarded to members of our congregation whose social location often marginalizes and silences their voices. People in this group are BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and other People of Color), LGBTQ+, young adults, youth, disabled people, and those whose socioeconomic status places them in the margins.

The selection process will prioritize current and emerging leaders and those members who have demonstrated a deep commitment to serving their church. A scholarship recipient who wishes to be a delegate should be strongly considered for that appointment.

Cost barriers to participation include registration, ... lost wages, .. factors that may require support. Thus, the amount of financial support needed will vary among the applicants and from one event to another. It should also be noted that most Assembly events offer additional opportunities for defraying costs, especially through volunteering and through scholarships.

#### Scholarship recipients are invited to share their experiences by:

- I. Organizing or participating in workshops; or
- 2. Writing articles for the Advance; or
- 3. Participating in a worship service; or
- 4. Contributing learnings to the congregation in another meaningful way.

An ad hoc task force (has formed, and officially established – see 2/6/2024 UUCLB board minutes at members only google drive) to administer the Scholarships. 

#### **Another Successful Winter Lights Firsts!**

This year's Auction Committee was relieved that the waning COVID19 was finally rendering it safe to return to our Annual In-Person Service Auction Party as we know it. However, as time moved closer to the event, there seemed to be a new increase of COVID outbreaks. After weighing the facts, and considering all safety parameters, we moved forward on the cautious side. We decided to move the food back into Wylder Hall, but to stay with serving small potions on disposable individual plates. We also brought the use of utensils back but stayed with disposable plastic ware. Masks were optional this year and for those not comfortable with dining indoors yet, we made 2 tables and chairs available for outdoor seating. We also stayed with keeping the silent auction online, with our fabulously staffed kiosks available right up to closing.

A dual event – such as an auction with both online and live bidding formats - takes a lot of people power hours, but we tackled this new UUCLB frontier last year and were better prepared for the production of a Hybrid Service Auction this year. As usual, your Brilliant Auction Committee met to devise, design, and discuss for months before the event. We scrapped what didn't work, replaced it with what we would better serve us, added what was missing etc. from last year, and designed new system(s) for moving forward with better results for this year. And it worked! Last year the 2022-2023 service auction achieved its highest fundraising number to date. This year, 2023-2024, we beat that record high of **\$28,197.37** net with a new record high of **\$31,702.95** net! I would like to officially dedicate this year's record-breaking Service Auction Fundraiser to the memory of my predecessor Barbara Atlas. I know that this year's success would have made her so very proud.

As we learned last year, putting together 2 different types of auctions that run at the same time and intersect at one fixed point is not any easy task. They say "practice makes perfect"...we weren't perfect, but this year was far more doable; even the need for more volunteers wasn't any issue.

\*\*UU's show up!\*\* And UUCLB volunteers are no exception to this rule. The kind of flexibility, and cooperation that we experience every year did not disappoint this year. The spirit

of faith and dedication shined brightly to create another fantastic Auction. It's forever amazing to watch so many volunteers quickly roll up their sleeves and go to work! The leadership and dedication of the many teams always serves as a symbolic Chalice that stays lit through the entire process from beginning to end. There were fewer bumps in the road this year. As always, the UUCLB "We" brought love and collaboration, providing what it takes to pave the way for a smooth process that this year was much easier to navigate. The magic we create when we come together to make something bigger than ourselves is undeniable. I watched the magic fill Wylder Hall on Friday night and all-day Saturday – from morning into the evening, – where a good time was had by all! **WE ROCK!** 

This was my 10th year producing this event, and as I look back, I see how it has shaped me in my personal life and faith. I couldn't be prouder to say that this is my church, and you are my people. It's always a great day to be a UU, and an honor to serve UUCLB. That said, I would be remiss if I did not take a moment to thank a few key players this year.




#### A Reflection on Spiritual Practices


"The question 'Who am I?' is not really meant to get an answer; the question 'Who am I?' is meant to dissolve the questioner." ~ Ramana Maharshi

In many spiritual traditions, repeatedly asking the question "Who am I?" or a variation such as "Who is carrying this body?" is the central practice offered for awakening. Teachers like Ramana Maharshi and great Zen masters from China and Japan have used the repetition of this simple and profound question to guide students to discover their true nature. In the end, it is a question we must all ask ourselves. Without being aware of it, you take many things as your identity: your body, your race, your beliefs, your thoughts. Yet very quickly with sincere questioning, you will find yourself sensing a deeper level of truth.



#### **Board of Trustees Emergency Meeting January 30, 2024**

#### **Nature of Emergency**

The Unitarian Society of Ridgewood, NJ, requested that UUCLB sign on as a Supporting Congregation for their amendment to the Article II Amendments. A majority at the Jan. 25 Town Hall Council (16 of 26) voted to recommend the Board of Trustees approve this request. The deadline for Ridgewood to collect support is Feb. I, and in order to fulfill THC's request, the board needs to hold an Emergency meeting. After discussion, two board members voted that this was not a true church emergency and three approved.

#### **UUA Bylaws Proposed Amendments**

- Move that UUCLB be a Supporting Congregation of the following amendment to Article II Section C-2.2. Values and Covenant from The Unitarian Society of Ridgewood (Ridgewood, NI). APPROVED
  - Two Board members voted against this as it did not include the 8th Principle, which UUCLB adopted in 2022.
     We are reminded that being a Supporting Congregation would be neither a vote on its content nor an indication of how our delegates would vote at GA; it simply allows the amendment to go forward for discussion and placement on the GA agenda.

Titled: 7 Principles as Preamble - Hyde.

**Insert:** As UU congregations, we draw from our heritages of freedom, reason, hope, and courage, building on the foundation of love and principles that continue to nourish us, including:

The inherent worthiness\* and dignity of every person;

Justice, equity and compassion in human relations;

Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;

A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;

The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;

The goal of world community with peace, liberty and justice for all;

Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.

\* "worth" in original 7 Principles has been changed to "worthiness" by the author of this amendment.
