Our Congregation's History: 2023-2024

Historian Report 2023-2024 | Fred Kushner, with Rev. Lissa Gundlach

Affinity Groups: the BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) Fellowship group became established with a monthly meeting and several vibrant fellowship events. The LGBTQ+ group grew with monthly movie nights and community educational programs.

Fun and fellowship: Fall Boutique and Plant Sale, Service auction dinner (1/27/24), Halloween Trunk or Treat & Spaghetti Dinner (10/28), no talent/talent show (9/16/23), St. Patrick day (3/17/24), BIPOC Poetry Reading event 4/28/24.

Social Justice: Saving Democracy group was established, just in time to focus on our upcoming November election. A Native Justice group also formed to educate and deepen indigenous solidarity. Heather Vickery from the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee visited, inspiring the development of our own Pink Haven Coalition chapter to support transgender individuals and families relocating to seek gender-affirming care.

Our partnership with Clergy and Laity for Economic Justice led members to support the hotel workers strike and were arrested committing civil disobedience in support of the workers. Our LA Voice Local Organizing Committee was involved in the successful "Home is Sacred" campaign to promote SB 4, a bill to promote development of affordable housing on faith lands. Their interfaith efforts made the New York Times! Rev. Lissa served as a "Deeper Roots" LA Voice fellow alongside other justice-centered interfaith clergy.

Our congregation continued commitments to environmental justice, including a fall solar tour and Earth Day program. We got out of the carbon producing business by selling our oil lease assets. Sold on 9/8/2023 for \$15,186 to Community Minerals II, LLC of Houston, TX. Proceeds from sale were moved to the Opportunity Fund. Other justice efforts included a large contingent in the Long Beach Pride Parade, a congregational presence at the historic Long Beach City Council meeting to pass a Ceasefire Resolution, and booth participation in the Long Beach Martin Luther King Day Parade. Through these commitments and outward facing fellowship events like Trunk or Treat and Easter, we increased our reach and impact in the greater Long Beach community.

Staff: We are so grateful for our hard working, talented, and dedicated staff. Over the summer and early fall, we were sad to lose three long-tenured staff members: Ronin del Castillo, accompanist, Naomi Yoshida, director of Religious Education and Francisco Ruiz, director of Music Ministries. Having these transitions at the beginning of the church year brought challenges and opportunities. Our programs continued to thrive with interim leadership support and strong volunteers. Danny Pravder served as an outstanding Interim Director of Music Ministries, serving from October-February. Search processes for open positions energized the congregation through feedback and engaging with

exciting candidates. Thank you to the Music Search Committee Jimmy Brink, Mack Scott-Baron, David James and Diana Tercero. Our successful search for a new Director of Music Ministries brought us the wonderful Gavin Thrasher, who started Mar 1, 2024. Under Gavin's leadership, the choir has grown from 16 members to ~20 members. We also welcomed new Religious Education Staff: Nneka Ahmad (Religious Education Assistant) & Kris Gomez (Nursery Caregiver.) We are hopeful that our new Religious Education Director should be joining us in June. Thank you to our Religious Education Search Committee April Rosario (Consultant) Laura Scully, Steve Soddors, Ruth Goodwin and Priscilla Ortiz.

Music and Arts: We had six successful concerts. Which contributed to our reach out in Long Beach and to other music lovers. Of note was Emma's Revolution, a UU favorite. We gave a stage for talented artists to perform, and incredible musical guests who uplifted our worship and mission.

Worship: Inspired by our 8th principle call to build a "diverse, multicultural Beloved community" our services included authentic cultural expressions, including Arab American, Asian American and Pacific Islander, Black History, Persian, and Native American. We also had member-led services from Green Team, LGBTQ+, Atheists, Buddhists, Saving Democracy, Banned Books (UUCLB Librarians) and Rooted in Reverence. We saw new membership in our Nature's Path Pagan group, and uplifted multiple faith traditions within our annual worship calendar, including celebrating the Jewish holidays, Diwali, Lunar New Year, Equinoxes, Christmas, Easter, and Beltane. Services are involving more participation and empowering our members to share authentically, rooted in our Unitarian Universalist values and principles. We heard powerful testimonials from members sharing their faith stories and identities. Joys and sorrows was enhanced by a roving microphone, encouraging newer people to share. With facilities & Church Office Administration assistance we installed a shaded area for people to sit outside and enjoy the service, a commitment to extending inclusive Covid precautions.

Small Group Ministry encouraged members to connect with one another guided by Soul Matters monthly theme-based Curriculum. The monthly themes this year were dedicated to exploring the values embedded in the Article II discussions. Worship, Religious Education and Small Group Ministries all followed the Soul Matters themes.

Conclusion: Thank you for a wonderful year, everyone. Thank you to our Board of Trustees for your leadership and dedication, and our Board President Edie Mickey-Silveria. Thank you to all of our amazing committees and volunteer leaders. Together, we make UUCLB a welcoming, anti-racist, Beloved Community: a safe haven for a diverse congregation. Our 2023-2024 historian's report is complete.

The Heart of Ida envisions a community where every senior has the support they need to live independently and thrive, including feeling heard, appreciated, connected, cared for, and safe. Last October, the Racial Justice Team asked who would deepen their knowledge of racial justice issues by participating in a common read. We asked those who "checked the box" to rank six books.

The winner: ***The 1619 Project***:

A New Origin Story – a Pulitzer Prize winning collection of essays created by Nikole Hannah-Jones.



The title comes from the historical fact that in 1619, enslaved people from Africa arrived in the Colony of Virginia. Mauricio Moreno and Michael Sallwasser will guide a discussion of selected sections from the book over five sessions starting Tuesday, July 9, at 6:00 on ZOOM.

Every Monday we will send an email reminder for the next meeting and the chapter that we will discuss. Michael or Mauricio will pose questions. Sometimes we will invite you to respond to the whole group with your thoughts via email. Other times we may ask to share your answers during the ZOOM meeting.

Mauricio will also include excerpts from a book of poetry written by Ron Dowell, DTM, a local poet who explores the meaning of the Watts Rebellion (aka Watts Riots) and recounts growing up in Watts and Compton in the 1960s.

Our Saving Democracy team at UUCLB urges you to write, phone or email President Biden, California's Senators, and your Congressperson with your UU values and the [February 14, 2024 message](#) from our Unitarian Universalist President Reverend Sofia Bentancourt in mind.

Let our elected officials know that our values do not support war, especially on civilian populations and that we do not want our aid to Israel to be used to attack Gaza.

The U.S. can use its power, influence, and foreign aid to Israel to promote peace over war, and the protection of civilian populations over military attacks that constitute potential acts of genocide.

Here is a possible script you might use:

As a member of the [Unitarian Universalist Church of Long Beach or UUCLB Saving Democracy Team or UUCLB Social Justice Council]: [I am/we are] called to "affirm the inherent worth and dignity of all human beings," and "work for a world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all." [I/we] join our Unitarian Universalist Association President in her statement that:

- condemns Israeli military's ongoing violence against Gaza,
- joins the growing chorus of voices across the United States and the globe in urging an immediate and total ceasefire,
- calls for the free flow of massive emergency humanitarian to Gaza and the safe return of all hostages and prisoners.

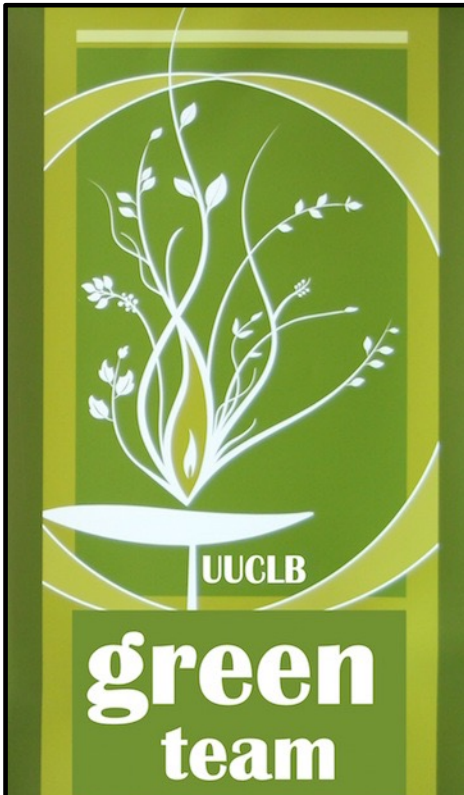

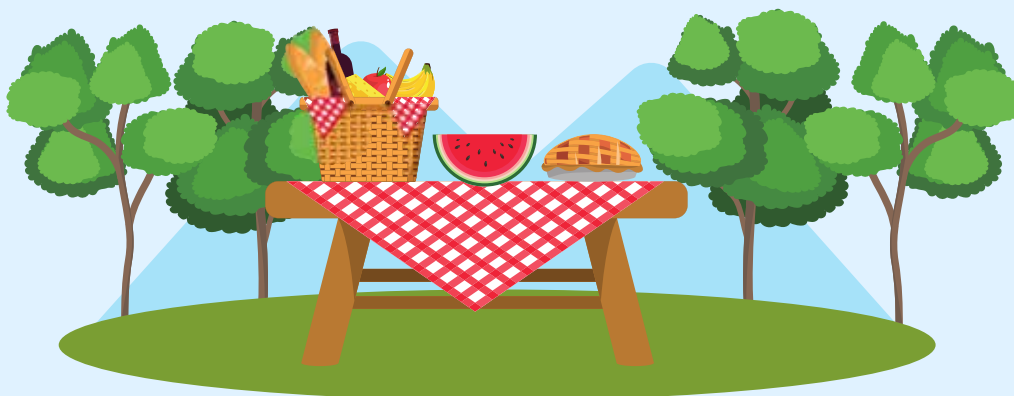
