HOW TO BECOME A CANDIDATE MEMBER- ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To become a Candidate Member with AIC Ontario and be eligible for Professional Liability Insurance (which is mandatory and MUST be purchased immediately when joining), we require proof of the following:

Two years Post- Secondary Education (College or University)
Note: <u>A university degree is required to attain a CRA or AACI Designation.</u>

If you have a College Diploma, it can be evaluated to see if further studies may produce course credits toward a university degree. This can be determined by contacting either <u>Thompson River University</u> or <u>Athabasca University</u>.

If you have a degree that was earned at an Institution outside of Canada, you are required to have it evaluated for Canadian Equivalency. You can contact either <u>WES(World Education Services)</u> Phone (416) 972-0070 or <u>University of Toronto- Comparative Education Services</u> Phone (416) 978-0393.

- 2. Completion of the AIC 101 Webinar
- **3.** Successful Completion of The <u>BUSI 330 via UBC</u>/ or <u>AIC 330 via Seneca College</u>(Foundations of Real Estate Appraisal)
- 4. Successful Completion of the AIC Introduction to Professional Practice- Provided via UBC(ITPP)
- **5.** Criminal Record Check done by the Appraisal Institute of Canada; facilitated by Sterling Backcheck (\$30 Plus HST)

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO BECOME DESIGNATED?

- **2-4 Years** for the CRA(Canadian Residential Appraiser) Designation
- 4-6 Years for the AACI(Accredited Appraiser Canadian Institute) Designation

CRA	AACI

With this designation you can appraise houses, semi-detached houses, townhouses of four units or less, condominiums and residential vacant lots or land.	With this designation you can appraise any type of property including land, agricultural properties, machinery and equipment and commercial and residential buildings.
