

PRESIDENT'S AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

The President's Award of Excellence is an award that was introduced for the 40th Anniversary of the Appraisal Institute of Canada - Ontario. This award recognizes a designated member who has demonstrated a significant contribution to the profession and the AIC – Ontario community.

Recipients of this award may excel in such areas as leadership, AIC affairs, government, promotion of the profession, research, mentoring and education.

Nominees need not be currently active in their profession but must be a member of the Appraisal Institute of Canada - Ontario in good standing. Nominations may be made by any member in good standing of the AIC Ontario.

Nominations are invited for the 2023 President's Award of Excellence, to be presented at the Annual General Meeting to be held May 4, 2023 in Waterloo Ontario.

The deadline for submission of nominations is March 31, 2023.

Criteria for nominations are include:

- Designated member 10 years or more.
- Demonstrated leadership in executive or professional areas of the profession
- Active as a volunteer within the Institute with an emphasis on provincial activity
- Recognition as a valued mentor whether under a formal mentoring agreement or informally as a valued individual who guided you in this profession
- Contributed to knowledge and education through presentations, publications, research
- Contributed to increasing public awareness and understanding of the profession
- Political activity on behalf of the AIC or AIC Ontario
