Following Wednesday's Prayers for Healing Service, **Hye Doon** cleaned our altar area, chancel, sanctuary, and mosaics in preparation for Holy Week services. Our gratitude to all of them for their service to our church.

Today's Gospel Reading

And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back; for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to any one, for they were afraid.

Following Today's Divine Liturgy

At the conclusion of Divine Liturgy, the faithful are all invited to follow Fr. Aren, the deacons and the choir into our Cultural Hall for the traditional Easter Home Blessing. Following the Home Blessing, the community is invited to participate in the Easter Tea sponsored by the St. John Women's Guild.

In addition, earlier this week, the Men's Society made *Nushkhar* (unconsecrated communion wafers) which will be blessed during the Home Blessing service. Families are invited to come forward and take one *Nushkhar* home (one per family please), and place it in your dry rice or baking flour. The *Nushkhar* in your home represents the presence of Christ.

Home Blessings

Traditionally after Christmas and Easter, as well as when moving to a new home or renovating your home or work place, families invite their pastor to their homes or workplace for a special prayer and blessing. This centuries old practice is also part of our heritage and tradition as Armenians. The only thing required for a Home Blessing is to have a piece of bread, dish of salt, and glass of water available for the blessing.

Home Blessings: If you would like the pastor to visit your home and conduct a home blessing service, please contact the church office.

Baptisms: Parents may prepare for their child's baptism before they are born. For more information, contact the church secretary. We encourage parents to baptize their children between the ages of 40 days and 3 months.

Weddings: Please contact the church office at least nine months before your anticipated wedding date. We ask that you please make sure to confirm your date with the pastor before booking a reception location.

Please be aware that more detailed information on these sacraments and online versions of the required forms are now on our website under "Liturgical Services."

Requiem Prayers (*Hokehankist*): Names may be submitted to the church office by mail, phone, email, or via the church website no later than 5 p.m. on Wednesday preceding the Sunday when prayers are requested. Requiem prayers may be offered any Sunday except for the five Tabernacle Feast Days.

Veils: In the Armenian Church, it is customary for women and girls to wear head coverings when attending the Divine Liturgy, and particularly when receiving Holy Communion. If you do not have a head covering, but wish to obtain one, kindly approach a parish council member.

Sunday Bulletin: Announcements for the print bulletin and e-Bulletin are due to the church office by 5 p.m. Wednesday.
