

Do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.






ST. PETER'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

WHILE WE ARE APART please check our website stpetersgv.org for updates and resources during the pandemic.

COVID RELATED UPDATES Chester County went green on June 26, but diocesan rules keep us in Phase 2 until mid-late July. Phase 3 guidelines are expected to be released on July 1. At this time all in-person gatherings remain restricted to 25 or fewer people and no food or drink is allowed. At St. Peter's we will continue to add outdoor in-person offerings throughout the summer. Our main Sunday morning worship will continue online until September. In late August we will begin to transition from pre-recorded, produced services to live-streaming worship. From there we will add in-person Sunday morning services. Worshipping from home, virtually, will remain an option for the foreseeable future.

PARISH HOUSE PROCEDURES In order to keep everyone safe, our clergy and staff continue to work from home as much as possible. Typically there is someone in the parish office on weekday mornings. Please call in advance to confirm. The number is 610-644-2261. Please note that masks are required inside the parish house and we request that you not enter individual offices. We love visiting with you, but please help us to keep you healthy by visiting from the hallway. Thank you!

RETURN TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP USHERS NEEDED Eventually we will return to in-person worship. You will receive plenty of information before that happens. As we prepare, we need to train ushers in new procedures. If you wish to serve as an usher for our initial offerings when we return to in-person worship, please contact Abigail at abigail@stpetersgv.org. In these unusual times, we will not assume that current ushers wish to serve in-person and also we recognize that some people who have not previously been ushers may wish to assist now. Be assured that we are not rushing into anything and we will be following all appropriate guidelines. This announcement is part of our preparation process. Thank you.

CONTINUING CONVERSATION ON RACE Thank you to those who participated in the conversation on Thursday, June 18. Our next conversation will be on Thursday, July 16 at 5:00 p.m. via Zoom. MOVIE NIGHTS July will present two opportunities to gather in small groups at the parish for a bit of fun. We have purchased an inflatable movie screen and projector and are able to show movies in the Rector's Grove. All safety precautions will be followed, including masks and physical distancing. Also, at this time diocesan rules prevent all eating and drinking. Bring your own chairs and blankets. Movies will begin as closest to 8:30 p.m. as possible (depending on the sun). Thank you for your understanding and we look forward to visiting virtually!

PLEASE DRIVE GENTLY One of the blessings of this pandemic time is that we are seeing a large, but safe, number of visitors on our beautiful church grounds. Many of them walk or jog over from Atwater. If you are driving on campus, please be especially careful, particularly at the turn in the exit road. Thank you!

FOOD MINISTRY The Food Drive will continue for the foreseeable future, although the receiving agencies may vary. For the month of June, the Outreach Commission is supporting the Community Youth and Women's Alliance (CYWA) Food Pantry in Coatesville with a financial contribution. One Commission member is helping to unload, sort and pack donated food and prepare it for distribution. Please continue to put your food contribution of canned goods, rice and beans in the bins on the porch outside of the Parish House. *We have received notice that pet food is welcome as well!* As always, the need is greatest for protein items including tuna fish and peanut butter. PLEASE SEND YOUR PICTURES/VIDEOS As we have become better at moving our worship experience online, we are seeking to include more members of our parish. One of the things that we miss is seeing you and hearing your voices. We usually 'go live' about 15 minutes before the service starts. During this time, we have been just showing a title page that says that the service will begin at 10am. We would like to augment that with pictures and/or videos of our parish family.
