Indeed, the whole earth is mine, but you shall be for me a priestly kingdom and a holy nation. These are the words that you shall speak to the Israelites.”

And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

The Holy Gospel

Matthew 9:35–10:23

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.”

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: “Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, ‘The kingdom of heaven has come near.’ Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment. [Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts, no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff; for laborers deserve their food. Whatever town or village you enter, find out who in it is worthy, and stay there until you leave. As you enter the house, greet it. If the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; but if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you. If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, shake off the dust from your feet as you leave that house or town. Truly I tell you, it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah on the day of judgment than for that town.

“See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. Beware of them, for they will hand you over to councils and flog you in their synagogues; and you will be dragged before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them and the Gentiles. When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say; for what you are to say will be given to you at that time; for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next; for truly I tell you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes.”





INVITATION TO CONVERSATION Living our faith in the world means engaging in the realities of our times. Grounded in our call to love God and neighbor, to seek and serve Christ in all people, to strive for justice and peace, and to respect the dignity of every human being, you are invited into conversation about race in America. To be clear, this gathering is not to reach resolution or conclusions. This is about speaking together honestly and respectfully. We yearn to become the change we seek. We long to build a beloved community--one that is just, fair, safe, and equitable. At St. Peter's one step will be a conversation about what is happening right now. From there we will build. Again, to be clear, this conversation will be facilitated by parishioner Shannon Mannon, who has training in leading community conversations and by the clergy, Abigail and Chris. BEGINNING TO GATHER AGAIN As you know, St. Peter's Church in the Great Valley is not closed. Our worship and programs continue in ways that are safe at this time. As restrictions begin to ease we will return to in-person gatherings with simple, but meaningful outdoor events that follow all the appropriate guidelines. You will find the June offerings listed below. We take seriously our call to love God and neighbor. Guided by scientific fact and grounded in faith, we will navigate the next stages of the Covid-19 pandemic intentionally and cautiously. For now, online Sunday worship at 10:00 a.m., either pre-recorded or live-streamed, will remain our primary service. There will be a Zoom meeting on Monday, June 15 at 5:00 p.m. to address any questions you might have. Thank you for your support and please do reach out to me with any concerns or questions you might have.

PLANNING FOR THE NEXT PHASE Last week in Keynotes a survey was included to help us plan our return to in-person worship. Please know we are following the guidelines established by our bishop, which are consistent with scientific standards. RETURN TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP USHERS NEEDED Eventually we will return to in-person worship. You will receive plenty of information before that happens. As we prepare, we need to train ushers in new procedures. If you wish to serve as an usher for our initial offerings when we return to in-person worship, please contact Abigail at abigail@stpetersgv.org. In these unusual times, we will not assume that current ushers wish to serve in-person and also we recognize that some people who have not previously been ushers may wish to assist now. Be assured that we are not rushing into anything and we will be following all appropriate guidelines. This announcement is part of our preparation process. Thank you.

VOLUNTEERS WANTED The Stewardship Commission is looking for new members. Our commission plans and executes the annual St. Peter's stewardship season. We generally meet once a month during the summer and fall months. Our group shares the work load in a collegial fashion and with a bit of fun thrown in. OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES ARE ON THEIR WAY We will return to some in-person offerings this month. In each case the following guidelines apply: masks must be worn and 6 feet of distance must be kept between people of different households. Additionally, in this very preliminary stage, the buildings will not be accessible for restroom or any other use. June 20 at 8:00 p.m. Summer Solstice Compline--A simple, spoken prayer service held at the labyrinth by candlelight. Please bring your own seating. Limit of 25 people.

June 24 at 6:00 p.m. BYOB Social Hour in the "rector's grove." Bring a beverage of choice and a blanket or chair. The current plan is to meet in-person. If restrictions in place at the time do not allow, we will meet virtually. Those who sign up will receive an email with up to date information. Limit of 25 people.

PLEASE DRIVE GENTLY One of the blessings of this pandemic time is that we are seeing a large, but safe, number of visitors on our beautiful church grounds. Many of them walk or jog over from Atwater. If you are driving on campus, please be especially careful, particularly at the turn in the exit road. Thank you!

FOOD MINISTRY The Food Drive will continue for the foreseeable future, although the receiving agencies may vary. For the month of June, the Outreach Commission is supporting the Community Youth and Women's Alliance (CYWA) Food Pantry in Coatesville with a financial contribution. One Commission member is helping to unload, sort and pack donated food and prepare it for distribution. Please continue to put your food contribution of canned goods, rice and beans in the bins on the porch outside of the Parish House.
