Thanksgiving of the Water

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Celebrant We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.



EVENSONG TODAY Please join us for a virtual All Saint Choral Evensong at 4:00 p.m. You will see and hear the choirs as they perform our annual All Saints' Day Choral evensong. Invite friends and neighbors to join us too, the evensong service will be easy to access in the same way you access the Sunday morning service. Our choir members have worked very hard rehearsing the music for our traditional All Saints' choral evensong in their Covid-safe homes. Among the works they are preparing are *Preces and Responses* by Richard Ayleward (1626-1669), *Evening Canticles* by Sir Charles V. Stanford (1852-1924), and the beautiful anthem "And I Saw a New Heaven" by Edgar Bainton (1880-1956). This video, by the way, will be a "first," because since the arrival of Covid-19, no recordings of evensong that incorporate an entire virtual choir have been available until now!
