The Second Lesson

Romans 8:12–25

Brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh— for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, “Abba! Father!” it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ— if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Jesus put before the crowd another parable: “The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, ‘Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?’ He answered, ‘An enemy has done this.’ The slaves said to him, ‘Then do you want us to go and gather them?’ But he replied, ‘No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.’”

Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, “Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field.” He answered, “The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!”



ST. PETER'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

WHILE WE ARE APART please check our website stpetersgv.org for updates and resources during the pandemic.

COVID RELATED UPDATES Chester County went green on June 26, but diocesan rules keep us in Phase 2. At this time all in-person gatherings remain restricted to 25 or fewer people and no food or drink is allowed. At St. Peter's we will continue to add outdoor in-person offerings throughout the summer. Our main Sunday morning worship will continue online until September. In late August we will begin to transition from pre-recorded, produced services to live-streaming worship. From there we will add in-person Sunday morning services. Worshipping from home, virtually, will remain an option for the foreseeable future.

PARISH HOUSE PROCEDURES In order to keep everyone safe, our clergy and staff continue to work from home as much as possible. Typically there is someone in the parish office on weekday mornings. Please call in advance to confirm. The number is 610-644-2261. Please note that masks are required inside the parish house and we request that you not enter individual offices. We love visiting with you, but please help us to keep you healthy by visiting from the hallway. Thank you!

OUTDOOR EUCHARIST TODAY at 4:00 p.m. please join us in front of the historic church for a simple, spoken service of Holy Eucharist. Our numbers remain restricted by diocesan rules. **As of this writing, four spots remain available.** To sign up, please contact Abigail at abigail@stpetersgv.org or go to: <https://www.signupgenius.com/go/8050B4EACA62EA1FE3-eucharist>. Details about current protocol will be provided to all who register, but please expect to wear a mask, maintain physical distance and bring your own seating. This will be a lovely, but informal service. Please dress comfortably and with the weather in mind.

FALL SUNDAY SCHOOL MEETING On Monday, July 27th at 6:00pm, all parents and teachers are invited to join Chris and Holly for a discussion about formation with our children in the fall. Understanding that we may, or may not, be gathering for Sunday School in the fall, we are seeking to understand what is working, what isn't working, what parents would like to see happen, and how the church can support parents in the Christian formation of our youngest members. Please let Chris Exley or Holly Hardester know if you plan to attend so that we can send you the Zoom meeting information.

SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL While we are apart, each week we are sending the parents of the Sunday school children emails with attached pictures, puzzles, coloring pages and games related to the scripture lessons for the coming Sunday. YOUTH MOVIE NIGHT on July 23. The youth group will gather to watch Zootopia on an inflatable movie screen and projector in the Rector's Grove. At least one parent must be present. Information for this has been emailed to youth members. Bring your own chairs and blankets. All safety precautions will be followed, including masks and physical distancing. NEEDLEWORK MINISTRY COMFORT Do you know someone who is struggling due to illness or grief or could simply use encouragement? The Needlework Ministry has created items to meet those needs. You can request a prayer shawl or lap blanket for someone who is ill in almost any weight or color. These also come with a cloth gift bag and booklet of prayers. If someone has lost hair due to chemo treatments, we have prepared chemo caps too. Other people could be sent a simple prayer square. We also need anyone to leave small containers which previously held fruits and veggies to help us safely transport these items. Please do not leave fresh items at other times to prevent wild animals from being attracted to the porch.

CONGRATULATIONS on a successful 700 cookies distributed to St. James in June!!! This month we would like to deliver **1000** homemade sugar cookies to the St. James School food pantry.
