Event Summary

The objective of this Africa Lead learning event is focused on sharing best practices and lessons learned across the continent from Africa Lead's central approach to transforming food security leaders and institutions through "facilitative leadership". The purpose of this event is to define facilitative leadership and demonstrate how it is used to get multiple stakeholders to collaborate in solving complex development challenges. The event will almost entirely feature counterparts and partners that have participated in or led facilitative leadership processes. We are holding this event on the third and final day of the closing event of Africa Lead's Executive Leadership Course for Africa's Food Security, a 6-month training program for leaders in East and Southern Africa. The learning event will feature several course participants who will share their recent facilitative leadership experiences.

Background

Africa Lead is one of USAID and Feed the Future's primary capacity building programs for advancing food security and resilience across the continent. The event is part of Africa Lead's multi-month Final Program Year Learning Series (learn more at www.africaleadftf.org/learning). The series, spanning June - November 2019 includes a variety of learning events that delve into Africa Lead's six years of program work across the continent. The series targets a wide-range of audiences including our African institutional partners in government, regional intergovernmental organizations, and non-state actor groups, as well as our USAID counterparts and partners at every buy-in level (Washington D.C., regional, and bilateral).
