



A historic milestone for the project was achieved today when the Nuclear Regulatory Commission issued the first 62 Reactor and Senior Reactor Operators licenses for Vogtle 3&4. Holding an operator license means that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission has determined that holder possesses the required knowledge, skills and abilities to safely and effectively operate the plant while maintaining the health and safety of the public as the primary mission. The achievement of this milestone demonstrates our commitment to *modeling high standards*.

The multi-year process for obtaining an operator license begins with extensive training in reactor theory, thermodynamics and system operation in the classroom and field. The operators spend months in the Main Control Room simulator running various scenarios under normal, abnormal and emergency conditions to ensure that the operators can safely respond to any issue or event. This process culminates with a two-week examination administered by the NRC.

Accomplishing this milestone ensures that there will be enough licensed operators to safely and efficiently operate Units 3 and 4 and is a testament to the dedication and commitment to the Training, Operations and Licensing departments, who powered through this challenge. We are proud of this team and this milestone.
