Since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, we have made significant adjustments to work practices on site, designed to protect the health and safety of the project workforce while maintaining productivity. We have also considered impacts from us not meeting desired productivity levels prior to COVID and the slower-than-expected recovery.

To fully assess the impact from the spring and these adjustments, we recently completed an evaluation and analysis of the Unit 3 schedule. This has allowed us to lay out a project plan that drives us to fuel load in 2020.
